No. 2 Grand View (Iowa) vs. No. 1 Cumberland (Ky.) - Game Notes

- This is the sixth-straight year that Rome, Ga., has served as the host site for the Russell Athletic-NAIA Football National Championship. There have been 45 different host venues in the 58-year history of the championship. One year after making history with the NAIA's first non-Saturday title game since the association returned to one division in 1997, the event returns to Saturday for a 4:34 p.m. EST kickoff.
- The average attendance over the last five years is more than 5,700 fans. The highest attendance of 6,500 occurred in 2008 when Carroll (Mont.) and Sioux Falls (S.D.) squared off for the second-straight season. Sioux Falls avenged its 2007 loss to Carroll with a 23-7 victory.
- Since moving to Rome in 2008, the average margin of victory is 5.8 points, including a three-point win by Marian (Ind.) last year. Since the NAIA went to one division in 1997, the national championship average margin of victory is 9.6 points. Ten of those 16 contests were decided by eight points-or-less.
- There have been 10 national championship shutouts since the event began in 1956. The last shutout came in 2000 when Georgetown (Ky.) blanked Northwestern Oklahoma State, 20-0. It is also the only shutout since the NAIA moved back to one division in 1997.
- Seven ties have occurred at the NAIA Football National Championship, including a 0-0 draw between Montana State and St. Joseph's (Ind.) in the event's inaugural game (1956). The last tie was a 21-21 stalemate between Central Washington and Findlay (Ohio) in the 1995 Division II title game.
- Last season's 30-27 overtime thriller between Marian and Morningside (Iowa) was the first NAIA Football National Championship game to go into extra time. The Knights, who were only in their sixth-year of existence, won the game on a Mike Josifovski 26-yard field goal. Josifovski also connected on a 35-yarder as time expired to send the game into overtime.
- Both Cumberland (Ky.) and Grand View (Iowa) are appearing in their first-ever national championship, marking the second-straight year that two title game rookies will play for a national crown. There have been 16 all-time national championship games that featured two newcomers, with two occurring since the NAIA returned to one division in 1997.
- No matter which team wins on Saturday, the victor will become the third-straight program to win a title in its first championship appearance – Marian in 2012 and Saint Xavier in 2011 are the other two.
- Cumberland and Grand View entered the playoffs as the first and second ranked teams in the final regular season edition of the NAIA Football Coaches' Top 25 Poll, marking the first time since 2010 that the top two ranked teams have reached the banner game.
- Since 1999, the first and second ranked teams have squared off for the title seven times with the No. 2 team owning a 6-1 record. The last and only No. 1 team to defeat the No. 2 squad for the championship came in 2005 when Carroll defeated Saint Francis (Ind.), 27-10.
- The lower ranked programs have won six of the last seven national championships.
- Cumberland and Grand View are the NAIA's lone remaining unbeaten teams at 13-0. This is the first time two undefeated squads have played for the national title since Carroll and Sioux Falls in 2010.
- Cumberland enters Saturday with a 5-6 all-time NAIA Football Championship Series record in seven appearances. Prior to 2013, the Patriots, who are the first team out of the Mid-South Conference to reach the title game since Georgetown in 2002, had never advanced beyond the quarterfinals.
- The Patriots are 2-3 all-time against current Mid-States Football Association teams at the national championship. Both of Cumberland's victories against MSFA opponents came in this year's NAIA Football Championship Series (FCS).
- Prior to 2013, Georgetown was the only Mid-South team to represent the conference in the title game dating back to 1997. The Tigers appeared in the contest four times with national titles in 2000 and 2001.
- The Patriots feature the NAIA's most potent rushing attack, averaging an NAIA-best 359.2 rushing yards per game and 4,669 rushing yards this season. Cumberland has ran for more than 300 yards in 10-of-13 games this season, including a season-best 475-yard effort against Pikeville (Ky.) on Sept. 26. In the playoffs, the Patriots are averaging 366 rushing yards per game and 6.0 yards per carry. Freshman quarterback Adam Craig, who was named the Mid-South's Freshman Offensive Player of the Year, paces the team with 1,157 yards and 24 touchdowns on 208 attempts. Senior running back D'Angelo Jordan is second on the team with 1,130 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns. Jordan raced for a career-high 270 yards on 25 carries in the Patriots 28-14 win against Saint Francis in the FCS Quarterfinals on Nov. 30.
- In addition to Jordan and Craig, tailbacks Hunter Lewis and Terrance Cobb have

- more than 500 yards on the ground. Lewis is third on the team with 578 yards on 72 carries, while Cobb is fourth with 529 yards on 92 carries. Cobb, an AFCA-NAIA All-American and the team's leading rusher with 1,991 yards last season, has battled injuries all season and will not play in the championship game.
- The Patriots have had at least one individual reach 100 yards rushing in six-straight games.
- The Cumberland's offense also ranks among the top 10 nationally in third down conversion (1st; 53.8 percent), total scoring offense (1st; 593), scoring offense per game (2nd; 45.6), total offense per game (6th; 478.8), first downs per game (6th; 24.4) and pass efficiency (9th; 155.8).
- Defensively, the Patriots rank 11th in the NAIA in scoring defense, allowing an average of 19.6 points per game. Cumberland has held seven opponents to 17 points-or-less this season, including a 38-0 shutout win against Kentucky Christian on Nov. 9. Additionally, the unit surrenders 345.1 yards of total offense per game, including 128.5 yards on the ground.
- The Patriots own a +11 turnover margin this season.
- Linebacker Weston Hazelhurst, a first team All-Mid-South East Division selection for the second-straight season, leads the team with 114 tackles (45 solo), 17.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. Arguably his best performance of the season came in the FCS Semifinals against Carroll, when the senior registered a season-high 17 tackles and a sack.
- Cumberland has eight victories against ranked opponents this season.
- Similarly to 2012 national champion Marian, Grand View reaches the title game in only its sixth year of existence. The Vikings are playing in their second FCS and own a 3-1 record.

- Grand View has never played a Mid-South Conference opponent in the FCS.
- The Vikings are the third-straight team from the Mid-States Football Association to play for the title. A Grand View victory will also make it three-straight championships for the league.
- Much of the Vikings success this season is predicated on a defense that ranks first in the NAIA in sacks (53) and second in rushing defense per game (85.2), total defense per game (266) and scoring defense per game (14.8). Grand View has only allowed one opponent to score more than 21 points this season, and registered a 35-0 shutout of defending national runner-up Morningside on Dec. 7.
- Only one individual – Sam Tvedt of William Penn (Iowa) – ran for more than 100 yards against Grand View's defense this season.
- Senior linebacker and Mid-States Football Association Midwest Defensive Player of the Year Jason Gladfelder is the cornerstone of the Vikings' defense. He leads the squad with 76 tackles (61 solo), 25.5 tackles for loss and 15 sacks, while ranking second on the team in interceptions with three.
- Sophomore quarterback Derek Fulton, who is in his second full season as the starter for Grand View, is the sparkplug for the Vikings' offense. He enters Saturday ranked seventh in the NAIA in total offense (3,784) and passing (3,151). Fulton is completing 64.2 percent (231-of-36) of his throws this season, including 30 touchdowns. He has thrown for more than 275 yards six times this season, including a season-high 312-yard effort against Morningside in the FCS Semifinals on Dec. 7. He also leads the team in rushing with 633 yards on 153 carries.
- Fulton's favorite target this season has been junior wide receiver Brady Roland. Roland leads the Grand View receiving corps with 76 catches (fourth-best in the NAIA) for 1,220 yards (third-best in the NAIA) and 13 touchdowns. Roland caught at least one touchdown pass in 10-of-13 games this year.
- As a team, Grand View averages 37.5 points and 458.5 total yards per game – both of which rank among the top 10 in the NAIA.
- Grand View has eight victories against ranked opponents this season.
- Eight teams in the year's FCS have made at least 10 postseason appearances (including this year): Carroll (21), Georgetown (19), Northwestern (Iowa) (17), Saint Francis (14), Baker (Kan.) (13), Benedictine (Kan.) (12), Missouri Valley 11 and Morningside (Iowa) (10)
- There were nine repeat programs from the 2012 FCS First Round.
- The Heart of America Athletic Conference (HAAC) and Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference (KCAC) landed the most squads in the 16-team field with three teams each.
- Defending national champion Marian (Ind.) was the first team to miss the playoffs the year following its national crown since Findlay (Ohio) – 1997 national champion with a 14-7 win over Willamette (Ore.) – in 1998.

Brian is the head football coach at Johnston High School; Joe serves as Grand View's defensive coordinator; Matt is the head men's basketball coach at Truman State; Andy is assistant men's basketball coach at Grand View.

John Bland is in his eighth season as the head football coach for the Patriots, having finished the 2013 campaign 13-0 overall and 6-0 in the Eastern Division. The team finished first in the eastern division and earned the NAIA's No. 1 ranking in the final poll.

In 2012, the Patriots had 14 players represented on the All MSC-East Team and two Conference Players of the Year.

From 2006 through 2013, Bland has lead the Patriots to five conference championships, seven NAIA Playoff appearances, captured the Brass Lantern six out of seven times, has been named MSC Coach of the Year four times and Regional Coach of the Year once in 2008. His total record at Cumberland's is 70-20 and his overall record as a head coach is 75-25. Since 2006, there has been 91 All Conference players, 19 All-Americans, 8 Conference Players of the Year, 45 Academic All-Conference selections, and 12 Academic All-Americans. In 2009 and 2010, the American Football coaches Association(AFCA), selected P.J. Hughes ('09) and Madison McCalmon ('10) to the All State Good works team.

Bland came to the Patriots after spending five years as the quarterbacks coach at NCAA Division I-A Rice University in Houston, Texas. While at Rice, Bland under Ken Hatfield's reign, was instrumental in assisting the Owls' in gaining the most wins in a season since 1953 with an 8-4 record in 2001. Since that time, Rice was sixth in the nation in rushing in 2002, second in 2003, and led the nation in 2004. Bland's quarterbacks accounted for almost one-third of the team's rushing totals during that time and in 2003 his quarterback was the first in Rice history to rush and pass for 2000 yards in a career.

Prior to Rice, Bland coached at NCAA Division II Southern Arkansas University. Bland served as an assistant coach from 1994-1999 and was promoted to head coach in 2000. While there, Bland's offense broke several school and conference records, led the conference in scoring in 1998 and 1999, and was among the conference leaders in most offensive categories. In 1997, the Muleriders won the Gulf South Conference championship and were ranked 10th nationally.

Bland also gained invaluable experience at Central High School in Columbia, Tennessee where he served as an assistant coach for two years. In graduate school, at Auburn University, he worked as a graduate assistant under Pat Dye and while completing his undergraduate degree at the University of Arkansas he served as a student assistant.

Bland spent his collegiate playing days at the University of Arkansas where he was a four year letterman as a quarterback. While in Fayetteville, Bland helped the Razorbacks to four consecutive bowl appearances in the Holiday, Liberty, Orange, and Cotton Bowls. He was named the permanent captain for the 1988 Southwest Conference Championship squad that competed in the Cotton Bowl.

Coach Bland holds a master's degree in Kinesiology from Auburn University and a bachelor's degree, also in Kinesiology, from the University of Arkansas. Originally from Knoxville,

Tennessee, Bland is a graduate of Farragut High School where he was an All-State recipient playing at the quarterback and defensive back positions.

"I am thankful to God to have been given the opportunity to coach and have such a supportive family. I believe University of the Cumberland's is a quality university in a nice, small town and a great place to raise a family. My passion and calling, I feel, is to help mold young men into leaders of our community. At Cumberland's, the environment allows me the opportunity to be involved in every aspect of the student-athletes lives. The chance to see young men develop spiritually, academically, and athletically is one of the most appealing aspects," said Bland.

UC Athletic Director Randy Vernon stated, "We are very happy and fortunate to have Coach Bland on our athletic staff. His qualifications and experience are second to none and Cumberland's football program will benefit under his leadership. He is a quality individual and his morals and standards are a perfect fit for what University of the Cumberland's is trying to pass along to our student-athletes."

Coach Bland and his wife, Candis, reside in Williamsburg with their three children, Shreve, Jade, and Bo.

National Defensive Players of the Week

Zach Hollier • LB • Grand View (Iowa) • So. • Beaumont, Texas

Sept. 2 Hollier, a sophomore linebacker from Beaumont, Texas, set a career-high with eight tackles, including two tackles for loss and two sacks, in Grand View's 21-16 victory over NCAA Division I FCS Drake (Iowa). Additionally, Hollier had a key interception in the second half that stalled a Drake offensive series. With the performance, he ranks amongst the top five nationally in forced fumbles (1st), sacks per game (3rd) and total sacks (3rd).

Zach Dolph • LB • Saint Xavier (Ill.) • Sr. • Crest Hill, Ill.

Sept. 9 Dolph tied a career-best with 15 tackles to lead Saint Xavier's defensive unit in its 31-24 overtime win against defending national champion and second ranked Marian (Ind.) Sept. 7. The senior linebacker had 1.5 sacks in the game, none more important than his half sack in overtime that helped force a fumble to end the game. The Cougars allowed no second-half points in their season opener against the Knights. For his career, Dolph owns 10 games with double-digit tackles.

Erik Brown • DB • Ottawa (Kan.) • Jr. • Converse, Texas

Sept. 16 Brown recorded three interceptions to lead Ottawa's defensive unit in its 20-6 victory over No. 2 Missouri Valley. The junior defensive back added six tackles—including two solo—one pass breakup and a sack. Brown's defensive unit held the Vikings to a 1-of-7 mark on fourth down conversion attempts and forced four turnovers. His three interceptions tie him for second all-time in the Ottawa record book for interceptions in a single game. Brown also contributed on special teams, blocking a Missouri Valley field goal attempt which was picked up and returned 65 yards for a touchdown by teammate Morey Croson. Brown currently leads the NAIA with four interceptions on the season and ranks fourth in the nation in passes defended per game (2.5).

JerSean Walder • DB • Doane (Neb.) • Jr. • Allen, Texas

Sept. 23 Walder scored two defensive touchdowns and recorded a team-high six tackles to lead Doane's defensive unit in its 62-7 victory over Hastings (Neb.)—the Tigers first win at Hastings since 1997. The junior jumped on an errant snap in the end zone early in the second quarter and six minutes later returned an interception 38 yards for his second score of the game. Doane held Hastings to 171 yards of total offense in the contest and Walder's two defensive touchdowns tied a school record. With his two interceptions this week, Walder vaulted himself into the top ten nationally in total interceptions (10th, 2).

Kris Lehmann • LB • Sterling (Kan.) • Sr. • Smith Center, Kan.

Sept. 30 Lehmann recorded 16 tackles in Sterling's upset victory over No. 8 Tabor (Kan.). The senior personally caused a fumble and was part of a defensive unit that forced five turnovers in the overtime victory over the Bluejays. Lehmann recorded two and a half tackles for a loss—good for 13 loss yards—in the contest and leads the Warriors with five tackles for a loss—totaling 18.5 loss yards—on the season. Lehmann currently ranks among the top ten nationally in tackles per game (9th, 11.3).

Phil Latimer • DL • Nebraska Wesleyan • Jr. • Broomfield, Colo.

Oct. 7 Latimer, a defensive lineman from Broomfield, Colo., led the Nebraska Wesleyan defense with nine tackles, including five solo, as the Prairie Wolves took down No. 13 Doane (Neb.) 20-19. The junior also recorded 2.5 tackles for a loss, leading the Nebraska Wesleyan defensive unit that held the Tigers offense to 175 yards of total offense and six points in the upset win. Latimer currently ranks among the national leaders in tackles for loss per game (49th, 1.3) and total tackles for loss (50th, 6.5).

Andrew Stewart • LB • Kentucky Christian • Jr. • Cadiz, Ky.

Oct. 14 Stewart, a junior linebacker from Cadiz, Ky., led the unranked Kentucky Christian defensive unit with 14 total tackles, including eight solo, in a 22-14 victory over then-No. 17 Lindsey Wilson (Ky.). The junior also recorded two tackles for a loss, by way of two sacks, in the upset. Most impressively, Stewart added two interceptions, including one that he took back 21 yards for his first collegiate touchdown—and the Knights first score of the game—with just under nine minutes to play in the first half. With his two-interception performance, Stewart is now tied for the team lead in interceptions (2). He also leads the Knights in total tackles (60) and solo tackles (32) and ranks second on the team in tackles for a loss (9.5). Terach Antoine • DE • Tabor (Kan.) • Sr. • Fort Pierce, Fla.

Oct. 21 Antoine, a senior defensive end from Fort Pierce, Fla., led then-No. 13 Tabor with 14 total tackles, including nine solo, in a 20-19 victory over then-No. 15 Friends (Kan.) in the NAIA Football Game of the Week. The senior also recorded five tackles for a loss, three of which were sacks, to help the Bluejays hand Friends its first Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference loss of the season. The Bluejays win knots Tabor and Friends, as well as Ottawa (Kan.) and Sterling (Kan.), atop the KCAC at 4-1 with Tabor holding a slight edge with a 6-1 overall record. Oct. 28 Dolph set a Saint Xavier single-game record with 23 tackles in the Cougars 12-6 win over William Penn (Iowa). The senior had five solo tackles, 1.5 tackles for a loss and .5 sacks in the victory, leading a Cougar defense that did not allow a touchdown and held William Penn to just 199 yards of total offense. With this week's victory Saint Xavier moves to second in the Mid-States Football Association Midwest League (3-1) behind Grand View (Iowa) (4-0). Nov. 4 Hicks tied a Morningside single-game record with three interceptions in the Mustangs 48-31 win over then-No. 25 Concordia (Neb.). The junior also recorded a pass breakup and two solo tackles in the contest. With the win, the Mustangs (7-0) earned at least a share of the Great Plains Athletic Conference regular-season title. Northwestern (Iowa), Dakota Wesleyan (S.D.) and Doane (Neb.) (5-2) are tied for second in the conference with two weeks left to play in the regular season. With this week's performance, Hicks now leads Morningside in interceptions (3) and ranks 30th nationally in the category.

Ty Phillips • DL • Missouri Valley • Jr. • East St. Louis, Ill.

Nov. 11 Phillips led Missouri Valley with seven tackles—including five solo—as the Vikings defeated then-No. 4 Benedictine (Kan.), 42-14. The junior also recorded 3.5 sacks and 4.5 tackles for a loss in the matchup, anchoring the Missouri Valley defensive front that gave up just seven rushing yards all game. Phillips leads the Vikings in tackles (51), tackles for a loss (21) and sacks (8) on the season. He also ranks among the national leaders in tackles for a loss per game (1st, 2.6), tackles for a loss (3rd, 21), sacks per game (6th, 1), fumbles forced per game (10th, .3) and total sacks (12th, 8).

National Offensive Players of the Week

Bryce Baker · QB · Rocky Mountain (Mont.) · Jr. · Fernley, Nev.

Sept. 2 Baker led the Battlin' Bears to a 35-30 upset win over No. 14 Southern Oregon on August 31. The junior quarterback, who is receiving the national offensive weekly honor for the second time, threw for a 2013 NAIA single-game best 517 yards, including three touchdowns in the win. Baker completed 31-of-51 passes (60.7 percent) and was intercepted twice.

E.J. White · QB · St. Francis (Ill.) · Sr. · St. Cloud, Fla.

Sept. 9 White set a school record with 429 passing yards in St. Francis' 43-26 win at Olivet Nazarene (Ill.) last Saturday. He completed 23-of-29 passes and tied a second program single-game mark with six touchdowns. The senior added 19 rushes for 95 yards en route to a career-high 524 yards of total offense for the game. Through two weeks of NAIA football, White leads the nation in pass efficiency (271.8), passing yards per game (429.0) and total offense per game (534.0). White has won the National Offensive Player of the Week award two previous times – Oct. 10, 2011 and Oct. 24, 2011.

Melvin Mason · RB · Southern Oregon · Fr. · Valencia, Calif.

Sept. 16 Mason recorded a career-high 236 rushing yards against NCAA Division I FCS Sacramento State (Calif.). The freshman recorded go-ahead touchdown runs of 76 and 55 yards in the fourth quarter, but the Big Sky opponent held on for a 63-56 victory. Mason currently ranks among the NAIA leaders in total rushing (11th, 296 yards), total scoring (13th, 26 points) and all purpose yards (14th, 365).

Josh Miller · QB · Saint Francis (Ind.) · Sr. · Lima, Ohio

Sept. 23 Miller completed 68 percent of his pass attempts in Saint Francis' victory over No. 7 St. Ambrose (Iowa). The senior quarterback threw for a career-best 412 yards, while completing 18 passes for first downs. Miller is the first Saint Francis quarterback to throw for over 400 yards in a game since 2002 and his 412-yard performance ranks third on the Cougars single-game list. Miller's lone touchdown pass came in the fourth quarter, when he hit freshman wide receiver Seth Coate from eight yards out for what would prove to be the game-winning touchdown. Miller currently ranks among the NAIA leaders in total offensive yards per game (8th, 319.5), passing yards per game (11th, 286.5) and pass efficiency (13th, 156.9).

Christopher McGinnis-Parker · RB · Eastern Oregon · Sr. · Stockton, Calif.

Sept. 30 McGinnis-Parker rushed for a game-high 187 yards on 31 carries in the Mountaineers upset victory over No. 3 Carroll (Mont.). The 187-yard performance was also a career-high for the senior running back. McGinnis-Parker recorded four touchdowns on the day: three by way of the rush and one via a 19-yard reception—his lone catch of the game—that would prove to be the game-winning score. Three of McGinnis-Parker's touchdowns came in the fourth quarter, as Eastern Oregon mounted a comeback against the Fighting Saints. He becomes the first Mountaineers running back since Oct. 30, 2010 to have 30 plus carries in a single game and the first since Sept. 17, 2011 to rush for three touchdowns in a game. McGinnis-Parker ranks among the NAIA leaders in total scoring (11th, 42 points), total rushing yards (15th, 429), all purpose yards (30th, 508), scoring per game (31st, 8.4 points) and rushing yards per game (39th, 85.8).

Austin Dodge · QB · Southern Oregon · Jr. · Vancouver, Wash.

Oct. 7 Dodge, a junior from Vancouver, Wash., threw for 559 yards and eight touchdowns—both Southern Oregon single-game records—as the Raiders toppled Montana Tech 59-32. The quarterback distributed the attack, completing passes to eight different receivers including three who totaled at least 140 receiving yards. After starting the season 0-3, Dodge has led Southern Oregon to three-straight victories by an average margin of 42 points. Dodge, who has throw for at least 300 yards in each of the Raiders six games, leads the NAIA in passing yards per game (411.7), total offense (2501 yards), total offensive yards per game (416.8) and total passing (2470 yards).

Cameron Fore · RB · Benedictine (Kan.) · Sr. · Rolla, Kan.

Oct. 14 Fore rushed for a school-record six touchdowns in Benedictine's 62-37 victory over Avila (Mo.) in Heart of America Conference play. By halftime, Fore had tied the school record with five rushing touchdowns including scores from 43 and 55 yards. The record-breaking score came with just under nine minutes to go in the third quarter, when Fore found his way into the end zone from 25 yards out. The touchdown cemented Fore's place in the Benedictine record book, not only for rushing touchdowns, but also for single-game scoring (36 points). The running back accumulated 236 yards on 21 attempts, bringing his season total to 816 yards in six games. The Ravens running back ranks among the top 25 nationally in total scoring (4th, 86 points), scoring per game (4th, 14.3 points), total rushing yards (7th, 816), rushing yards per game (8th, 136), all purpose yards (16th, 859) and all purpose yards per game (17th, 143.2).

Austin Dodge · QB · Southern Oregon · Jr. · Vancouver, Wash.

Oct. 21 Dodge threw for 469 yards and five touchdowns as the Raiders topped then-No. 18 Montana State-Northern 55-28. The quarterback completed passes to eight different receivers, including two who went for over 150 yards in the contest. This was Dodge's fifth-straight game with at least five touchdown passes and the Raiders fourth-straight victory after starting the season 0-3. In those wins, the Raiders have recorded a 38-point average margin of victory and Dodge has averaged 461 passing yards and six touchdown passes. After going 0-2 in the Frontier Conference to start the season, Dodge has the Raiders up to third in the league (4-2), just one game behind Carroll (Mont.) and Rocky Mountain (Mont.) (5-1).

Matt Westerkamp · QB · Robert Morris (Ill.) · Jr. · Lombard, Ill.

Oct. 28 Westerkamp completed 21-of-29 passes to lead Robert Morris to a 28-24 upset victory over then-No. 4 Saint Francis (Ind.). The quarterback threw for 177 yards and three touchdowns in the contest, capping the game with a 67-yard scoring drive late in the fourth quarter. On that drive, Westerkamp connected with wide receiver Deshawn Weaver for the game-winning 17-yard touchdown with 33 seconds left on the clock. The victory brings Robert Morris to 2-2 in the Mid-States Football Association Mideast League, keeping the Eagles playoff hopes alive.

Eric Williamson · QB · St. Ambrose (Iowa) · Sr. · Springfield, Ill.

Nov. 4 Williamson, a senior quarterback from Springfield, Ill., set St. Ambrose career records for completions (593) and total offense (7,555) in the Fighting Bees 65-30 win over then-No. 14 Saint Xavier (Ill.). He also owns the program's career record for touchdowns (74). In the contest, Williamson amassed 355 passing yards, six passing touchdowns and a team-high 92 yards rushing. His 447 yards of total offense in the matchup fell five yards shy of the St. Ambrose single-game record. With the victory, St. Ambrose (4-1) sits in second place in the Mid-States Football Association Midwest League behind Grand View (Iowa) (5-0), who is No. 3 nationally.

Theo Bartman · RB · Northwestern (Iowa) · Sr. · Rock Valley, Iowa

Nov. 11 Bartman rushed for 123 yards and a career-best four touchdowns as Northwester (Iowa) defeated then-No. 1 Morningside (Iowa), 38-28. With his performance, Bartman moves into ninth place on Northwestern's all-time list with 26 career rushing touchdowns. The senior, who had a career-high 33 carries in the contest, also added 57 receiving yards on four catches. This season, Bartman has been a key cog in the Northwestern offense, leading the team in rushing yards (640), touchdowns (11) and all-purpose yards (1,048) while ranking among top 25 nationally in scoring per game (13th, 9.7 points) and all-purpose yards per game (14th, 149.7).

Zach Keenan • K • Benedictine (Kan.) • Sr. • Alton, Ill.

Sept. 2 Keenan, a senior kicker from Alton, Ill., connected on field goals of 41, 43 and 44 yards in Benedictine's dominating 30-9 victory against Briar Cliff (Iowa) on August 31. Additionally, Keenan converted 3-of-3 extra points en route to scoring 12 points on the afternoon. He is second on the Raven's all-time kickers scoring list with 212 career points – eight points shy of tying the record of 220.

Albert Huntley • RB • Cumberlands (Ky.) • Sr. • Mableton, Ga.

Sept. 9 Huntley shined on special teams in the eighth-ranked Patriots 41-10 win over No. 25 Cumberland (Tenn.) on Sept. 7. The senior blocked a punt early in the second quarter, which was returned 15 yards to pay dirt, propelling Cumberlands to an early 14-0 lead. Huntley struck again in the fourth quarter with a 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown to seal victory.

Jordan Pedersen • K • Doane (Neb.) • So. • Crete, Neb.

Sept. 16 Pedersen went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, putting it through the uprights from 20 and 37 yards. The sophomore went 4-for-4 on extra point attempts in the Tigers 34-27 win over No. 13 Northwestern (Iowa) and is a perfect 6-for-6 on field goals and 5-for-5 on extra point tries this season. Pedersen also helped Doane control the early-game field position with his kickoffs, averaging 61.4 yards per kick, which pushed Northwestern's average starting field position in the first half back to its own 17 yard line. Sept. 23 Phillips was perfect in McPherson's win over Bethel (Kan.). The senior went 3-for-3 on field goal attempts in the game, including one from a season-long 39 yards, and is 6-for-6 on the year. He's also 14-for-14 on extra point attempts, including 6-for-6 in this week's contest. Phillips currently leads the NAIA in field goal percentage (1.000) and PAT kicking percentage (1.000) and is second in the nation in total field goals (6), total scoring for kickers (32 points) and scoring per game for kickers (10.7 points).

Spencer Nolan • K/P • Saint Xavier (Ill.) • Sr. • Columbia, Tenn.

Sept. 30 Nolan, a Columbia, Tenn., native, tied a Saint Xavier record with five field goals in a road victory over No. 22 St. Francis (Ill.). Nolan went 5-for-5 on field goal attempts in the contest, including one from a game-long 46 yards out during the third quarter. He also averaged 58.5 yards per punt on the night, including a season-long 65 yard punt. Oct. 7 Harrison, a Pasadena, Calif., native, had three kickoff returns for a combined 107 yards—including a season-long 46-yard return—as Faulkner defeated No. 5 Georgetown (Ky.) 55-31. But, the highlight of the game for the Eagles senior wide receiver and return man came when he fielded a punt at the 3-yard line and returned it 97 yards for a touchdown on the final play of the third quarter. The score was the first return touchdown of Harrison's collegiate career and just his second touchdown on the season. Owen Cole • RB • Tabor (Kan.) • Fr. • Freeport, Fla.

Oct. 14 Cole had two kickoff returns for a combined 125 yards for the Bluejays. The freshman, who also sees time at running back, highlighted his second game returning kicks by taking a second quarter kickoff 96 yards for his first collegiate touchdown. Prior to Saturday's performance, Cole's career-long kickoff return was just seven yards. On offense, Cole added five rushes for 31 yards and one reception for four yards in Tabor's 54-28 trouncing of Kansas Wesleyan. With the victory, Tabor sits at 5-1 on the year, including a 3-1 mark in Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference play.

Nu'keese Richardson • WR • Pikeville (Ky.) • Jr. • Pahokee, Fla.

Oct. 21 Richardson returned a pair of punts for touchdowns to help secure the Bears 35-24 victory over Bethel (Tenn.). The first, a season-long 76-yard return for Richardson—one yard shy of the Pikeville record, gave the Bears a 28-10 lead in the second quarter. The second, which Richardson took to the house from 44 yards out during the third quarter, proved to be Pikeville's only score of the second half. Richardson, who also sees time at wide receiver, has one receiving touchdown on the season.

Clarence Clark • K/WR • Baker (Kan.) • Fr. • Phoenix, Ariz.

Oct. 28 Clark, a freshman kicker from Phoenix, Ariz., made two of the biggest kicks in Baker history to seal the Wildcats 13-10 upset victory over then-No. 6 Missouri Valley. Clark nailed a career-long 59-yard field goal to knot the game at 10-10 in the fourth quarter and then put one through the uprights from 52 yards out for the game-winning score in overtime. The freshman, who also sees time at wide receiver, has over 500 all-purpose yards and seven touchdowns on the season. But this week his right foot was the difference, pushing Baker into a three-way tie for second place in the Heart of America Athletic Conference standings (5-1-0).

Chris Mayer • K • Southwestern (Kan.) • Sr. • Tucson, Ariz.

Nov. 4 Mayer tied the longest made field goal in Southwestern history, putting one through the uprights from 50 yards out as time expired at the end of the first half. The kick brought the Moundbuilders to within one at the half (21-20) and initiated Southwestern's come-from-behind victory. Led by Mayer's perfect day, with two field goals and two extra points, the Moundbuilders went on to beat Saint Mary (Kan.), 32-29. The win puts Southwestern (4-3) two games back of the leaders (6-1) in the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference with two games left on the conference schedule.

Antonio Bray • RB • Sterling (Kan.) • Jr. • Van Nuys, Calif.

Nov. 11 Bray scored his third 100-yard kickoff return touchdown of the season as Sterling crushed Southwestern (Kan.), 48-14. On offense, the junior, who also sees time at running back, rushed for 218 yards and three touchdowns on thirteen carries. In all, he accounted for 418 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns, leading the Warriors in both categories. For the season, Bray leads the team in all-purpose yards (1,905) and touchdowns (16). He also ranks among the top 10 in the NAIA in kickoff return yards per attempt (1st, 34.5), all-purpose yards (3rd, 1,905), all-purpose yards per game (4th, 190.5), total kickoff return yards (4th, 759) and total scoring (9th, 96 points).

Marian (Ind.) Wins First-Ever Football National Championship

Knights' Mike Josifovski hits game-winning 26-yard field goal in overtime to claim the title

Dec. 13, 2012

ROME, Ga. – No. 5 Marian (Ind.) claimed its first-ever national crown by winning the 57th annual Russell Athletic-NAIA Football National Championship in overtime, 30-27, over No. 3 Morningside (Iowa) Thursday night at Barron Stadium in Rome, Ga. The Knights, who were playing in their first-ever national title game, outscored Morningside 20-7 over the final 15 minutes and overtime period en route to the victory.

"We have guys who don't quit," said Marian head coach Ted Karras, Jr. "They're true believers, and a lot of them were pioneers. We only started football literally six years ago. We recruit guys who are hungry - hungry to play and hungry to get their degree - who have a never-say-die attitude. These are quality guys, who get their business done - on and off the field.

Marian's placekicker Mike Josifovski, who sent the Knights to the championship contest with a 51-yard game-winning field goal in the semifinals on Dec. 3 against Missouri Valley, again played hero by converting a 35-yard field goal attempt as time expired to send the contest into the first overtime period in the 57-year history of the national championship. The Knight defense held strong in Morningside's overtime opportunity, setting up Josifovski for another game-winning attempt. He again did not disappoint, splitting the uprights on a 26-yard game-winning field goal. Josifovski was named Outstanding Offensive Player of the Game for his performance.

The Morningside offense seized control early, marching 70 yards on its opening possession to take a 7-0 lead at the 10:25 mark of the first quarter. The drive was capped by a Fred Jones 10-yard touchdown run, his first of two scores on the evening.

Marian (12-1) capitalized on a Mustang turnover to tie the score 7-7. However, Morningside responded with its second 70-yard scoring drive of the first quarter when Joel Nixon found Joel McCabe on a six-yard touchdown pass.

Josifovski nailed a 36-yard field goal with 3:55 left in the first half to make it a 14-10 Mustang advantage at the break.

Morningside (13-1) again drew first blood with its third 70-plus drive of the contest to open the second half scoring. Jones, who ran for more than 100 yards for the first time this season, tallied his second touchdown of the night on a 1-yard dive. After David Galloway missed the PAT, Morningside held a 20-10 advantage.

Marian pulled within three, 20-17, two minutes later when Tevin Lake found the end zone for the second time on a 4-yard run with 7:33 left in regulation. That score capped the Knight's longest drive of the game - 88 yards on 11 plays.

The Knights took their first lead of the contest with 2:46 remaining, 24-20, when Adam Wiese tossed his only touchdown pass of the evening on a 61-yard strike to Nathan Jones. It was Wiese's 29th touchdown pass of the season and 52nd of his career.

Faced with a fourth-and-15 on its own 44 yard-line, the game began to look in doubt for the Mustangs. However, Nixon, who completed 22-of-39 passes for 228 yards, found Kyle Schuck with a 35-yard pass to give Morningside a first down with the ball on the Marian 21. Morningside, aided by a Knight pass interference penalty, scored two plays later when Nixon connect with a wide open Schuck in the end zone. The touchdown gave the Mustang's a 27-24 lead with a 1:04 remaining, which proved not enough to withstand Marian's late-game heroics.

Wiese paced the Marian offense with 242 yards of total offense, including 223 through the air. Lake, who notched his ninth 100-yard performance of the season, finished with 104 yards and two touchdowns on 23 attempts.

Defensively, five Knights finished the game with double-digit tackles, including John Keever's game-high 18 stops. Robert Palmer was named Outstanding Defensive Player of the Game after positing 13 tackles, one tackle-for-loss, one interception and one forced fumble.

Team and Individual Notes

- Morningside (Iowa) opened up the scoring in tonight's game at the 10:25 mark of the first quarter. Teams that score first now own a 10-6 record since the NAIA went to one division in 1997 - Saint Francis (Ind.) in 2006 was the last team to score first and lose the national championship.
- Tonight's matchup was the time since 2007 that both teams scored at least one touchdown in the first quarter.

Saint Xavier (Ill.) Wins First National Championship

Cougars down Carroll (Mont.), 24-20

Dec. 17, 2011

ROME, Ga. – No. 5 Saint Xavier (Ill.) took home its first-ever trophy by winning the Russell Athletic-NAIA Football National Championship, 24-20, over No. 2 Carroll (Mont.) tonight at Barron Stadium. Appearing in their first title game, the Cougars top-ranked offense recorded 355 yards.

“This is indescribable,” said St. Xavier head coach Mike Feminis. “So many guys stepped up. Offensively, we have an All-America quarterback in Jimmy Coy and an All-America wide receiver in Shane Zackery. They had the best games of their year tonight. Our offense gets a lot of the attention but our defense came up big to win us the national championship.

Behind the legs and arm of senior quarterback and Outstanding Offensive Player of the Game Jimmy Coy, the Cougars (14-1) put pressure on the Carroll defense. Coy finished with 294 yards of total offense, with 216 coming through the air. He tossed one touchdown and found the end zone on the ground.

The Cougar offense was impressive early scoring on their first two drives of the game. Equally important was the unit eating up the clock. Tom Lynch booted a 20-yard field goal, which was followed by an eight-yard touchdown run by Coy. With 1:43 remaining in the first quarter, St. Xavier held a 10-0 advantage. Both drives spanned 15 plays and covered more than 70 yards each.

Carroll’s offense in the second quarter got going. Senior quarterback Dane Broadhead hit senior wide receiver Matt Ritter from 20 yards out to put the Fighting Saints on the board. That play culminated a 10-play, 62 yard drive. Coy and the Cougar offense responded quickly going 49 yards in nine plays and scoring on an 11-yard pass to junior wide receiver Shane Zackery.

With just over a minute left in the first half, Carroll did not lay down as it trailed 17-7. Broadhead engineered a quick strike by finding freshman wide receiver Anthony Clarke on a 26-yard score. That drive only took :43 on the clock.

At the half, St. Xavier led 17-14 as both offenses gained over 200 yards.

Freshman Jared Mayernik put the Fighting Saints in the lead for the first time by returning the second half opening kickoff 94 yards. After a Tom Yaremko missed PAT, Carroll held a 20-17 advantage. That kickoff return for a score was the first in the national championship since Adam Lopez of Sioux Falls (S.D.) went 91 yards for a touchdown in 2009.

The lead was short-lived for Carroll. Three minutes later, St. Xavier’s KJ Franklin rushed in from four yards out. That capped another long drive with 11 plays and 67 yards and would be the eventual game-winner for the team out of the Mid-States Football Association Mideast Division.

The Saint Xavier defense, which was overshadowed all season by the No. 1-ranked offense, put on a show in the second half. The Carroll offense had successive drives of zero yards, 12 and 20 that spanned into the fourth quarter. The Outstanding Defensive Player of the Game Patrick Appino was the star with five total tackles (four solo), 1.0 sack and 2.0 tackles-for-loss. He was part of a unit to tally 9.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks.

Junior strong safety Clayton Fejedelem led the Cougars with nine total stops (six solo) and three pass break-ups. Sophomore linebacker Zach Dolph and senior backer Michael Prosser each were credited with eight total tackles.

Defensively for Carroll, junior linebacker Thomas Robison went for 14 tackles (10 solo) and one tackle-for-loss.

Coy led all rushers with 78 yards on 16 carries for a 4.9 yard average. His favorite target was Zackery, who caught nine balls for 78 yards. Broadhead went 20-for-31 passing for 223 yards and two touchdowns for the Fighting Saints. Ritter had 11 catches for 117 yards. National Player of the Year Chance Demarais was held to 57 rushing yards on 21 carries for a 2.7 average.

Carroll, who was shooting for its seventh national title, ends its season with a 13-2 record.

- Saint Xavier becomes the first team since Carroll in 2002 to win the national title in its first game appearance.
- In the last five years, the national championship has not been decided until the final moments. The average margin of victory during that span was 6.8 points, including a three-point win for Carroll last season. In the five-year span prior (2001-05), the average margin of victory was 15.0 points.
- A win by Saint Xavier means that a team other than Carroll or Sioux Falls (S.D.) is the national champion for the first time since 2001.
- Members of the Mid-States Football Association (MSFA), Saint Xavier is the first team out of the MSFA to play for the title since Saint Francis (Ind.) appeared in 2006. The Cougars are the MSFA's first national champion since former NAIA school Findlay (Ohio) won it all in 1997.
- Carroll falls to 6-2 all-time in the National Championship.

In that span, the Player of the Year has played on a team that is 6-6 in the National Championship. This year, the Player of the Year was handed to Carroll's Chance Demarais.
- Carroll's Chance Demarais was limited to 57 rushing yards, with his longest run of the game covering 10 yards.
- The No. 2-ranked team entering the National Championship falls to 5-3 since 2000. The No. 5 ranked clubs are now 1-1 after the Saint Xavier victory. Saint Xavier is the lowest seed to reach the title game since No. 9 Carroll upset No. 2 Saint Francis (Ind.), 15-13, in 2004.
- With both teams entering Saturday with one loss, it snaps a six-year streak of both of the National Championship qualifiers being undefeated.
- The lower-ranked team has now won five of the last six national championships.

Carroll (Mont.) Wins Sixth National Championship With 10-7 Victory Against Sioux Falls (S.D.)

Fighting Saints erase Sioux Falls' 42-game winning streak

Dec. 18, 2010

ROME, Ga. – As a potential game-tying field goal sailed wide left, Carroll (Mont.) started to celebrate for the sixth time in school history. The No. 2-ranked Fighting Saints brought home the 2010 Russell Athletic-NAIA Football National Championship after a 10-7 victory against No. 1 Sioux Falls (S.D.) from Barron Stadium. In a game that was not decided until the final moments, Sioux Falls drove into field-goal range with less than 10 seconds remaining. The 46-yard attempt by USF's Braden Wieking missed to tie the score.

Since 2002, Carroll earns its sixth National Championship all under the direction of coach Mike Van Diest. The Fighting Saints improve to 4-1 all-time in the series with Sioux Falls. USF had its 42-game winning streak halted, which had tied an all-time NAIA record. Before today's loss, the last program to defeat Sioux Falls was Carroll in the 2007 National Championship.

"The score tells it all – it was a great battle," said Van Diest, whose Fighting Saints are now 6-1 in the National Championship game. "I felt our offensive line really controlled the line of scrimmage and Gary (Wagner) kept the plays alive. We are very excited. We talked about climbing the mountain a long time ago during two-a-day (practices). It was one step at a time and we never wanted to look back. It was a terrific ball game and my hats off to Sioux Falls for their tremendous run."

With both teams so evenly matched on paper, the game was destined to be a nail-biter.

Carroll, which ranked in the top-10 in rushing offense, was going up against a Sioux Falls defense to yield just 87 yards on the ground per contest. Behind the running tandem of seniors John Camino and Gary Wagner, Carroll rolled up 174 rushing yards. Camino finished with 81 yards on 24 carries, while the legs of quarterback Wagner netted 75 with one score.

In the game's opening drive, Carroll marched down to the 41-yard line of Sioux Falls and looked like they would score the first points. But, sophomore Eric Anderson sacked Wagner and forced the Fighting Saints to punt. Carroll would get more first-half scoring opportunities, though.

After the Carroll defense forced a three-and-out, the Fighting Saints again drove the ball into USF territory. Carroll converted a fourth-down play during the drive and ended up with a short field goal attempt. But, sophomore Tom Yaremko hit the right upright from 21 yards out and the game was still scoreless.

Sioux Falls threatened on its next possession as the passing game heated up. Senior quarterback Jon Eastman found junior Alex Anderson and senior Jon Ryan on a couple of pass plays to move the ball near midfield. A holding penalty on Sioux Falls stalled the drive and the Cougars were forced to punt.

As the game remained scoreless in the second quarter, the game was becoming more of a defensive battle. That was until Wagner found a hole in the middle of the USF defense. From his 17-yard line, the Outstanding Offensive Player of the Game broke a tackle and scampered 83 yards for a career-long rushing touchdown. After the PAT, Carroll held a 7-0 lead with 8:47 remaining in the second quarter.

"We had Bubba (Bartlett) and John (Camino) in there and they both did a tremendous job blocking," said Wagner on his 83-yard score. "Corey Peterson stuck his block and those are the only reasons I ended up scoring. I just tried to run as fast as I could – I'm sure it wasn't the prettiest form, but I don't care. I am so excited to be a part of this opportunity. I was in the right place at the right time and the right play was called and we scored a touchdown."

On the ensuing possession, Sioux Falls went to work offensively. In their best drive of the first half, the Cougars mixed in run and pass and drove 63 yards in 11 plays for the touchdown. Sophomore Jordan Taylor found the end zone from one yard out on a third-down play. With 3:02 showing on the clock, the score was tied at 7-7.

Carroll looked to take a lead heading into the locker room and had a chance to do so. The Fighting Saints drove to the USF 21-yard line, but a Yaremko attempt hit the left upright this time.

The second half was much of the same story, with both defenses making plays when they had to. Carroll moved the ball enough offensively that they won the field-position battle. The Fighting Saints pinned USF deep in its own territory twice in the third quarter. Because of that, the game stayed tied at 7-7 into the fourth frame.

After a third-quarter that saw Carroll move the ball twice into USF territory, the rushing game of the Fighting Saints took over. Starting at its own 41-yard line, Carroll rushed the ball 12 times on a 15-play drive. Camino ate up 25 hard-earned yards on the ground. The result of the lengthy seven-minute drive was a 22-yard field goal from Yaremko, his first in three attempts.

With 7:47 left in the fourth quarter, Carroll held the slimmest of leads at 10-7.

Playing with a sense of urgency, the Sioux Falls' offense clicked after the Carroll score. Eastman and company drove to the Carroll 31-yard line, before stalling. After three incompletions and a sack, Sioux Falls turned the ball over on downs.

But, Sioux Falls still got another chance after holding Carroll to a three-and-out. After a Carroll punt, Sioux Falls started its drive at its own 37-yard line with :26 left and no timeouts. Eastman found Ryan on two, 10-plus yard passes and Sioux Falls was in business. After a completion to junior Mike Hicks, the Cougars moved to the Carroll 29-yard line. That set up a chance for Wieking to be the hero and send the game to overtime.

Wieking's kick had plenty of distance from 46-yards out but was a few yards wide left.

Ryan, who was recognized as the 2010 Rawlings-NAIA National Football Player of the Year last night, ended his career with 90 receiving yards on seven catches. Eastman was 18-for-32 for 172 passing yards.

For Carroll, Wagner went 12-for-21 through the air for 107 yards. But, it was his feet that were difference. Bartlett hauled in five catches for 45 yards and junior Matt Ritter posted five receptions for 39 yards. The defensive hero for Carroll was AFCA All-American Thomas Dolan with six total tackles, including 2.0 tackles-for-loss.

With 17 total tackles, Sioux Falls' Anderson was named the Outstanding Defensive Player of the Game.

Cougars win fourth title overall, second straight

ROME, Ga. - Placekicker Braden Wieking hit three field goals and helped lead No. 1 University of Sioux Falls (S.D.) to its fourth national title after a 25-22 win against No. 3 Lindenwood University (Mo.) in the Russell Athletic-NAIA Football National Championship from Barron Stadium in Rome, Ga. In front of 5,000 fans, the game showcased the nation's top two offenses and ended with five lead changes.

The Cougars (15-0) have now won back-to-back titles and have their third ring in four tries. The win is their 29th straight win on the year, which is a school record.

"Winning a championship never gets old," said Sioux Falls head coach Kalen DeBoer, who wrapped up his fifth season with a 67-3 record. "Today was an unbelievable day for our program. These guys on the field poured their hearts out.

"We have a ton of respect for this Lindenwood team today. We knew that they were going to bring it and you could see the reason why they got here. That's a tribute to our guys and how they handled the ups and downs. Championships are won by how guys handle adversity and that is what we did today."

With both teams scoring over 700 points each this year, they got off to slow starts offensively. Lindenwood gained just one first down in the first quarter and 17 total yards. Despite 142 yards in the first 15 minutes, Sioux Falls netted just five points. However, these two teams just needed the first quarter to warm up.

Wieking hit his first 40-yard field-goal in the game, this one coming from 41 yards out to give USF a 3-0 advantage with :54 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

On Lindenwood's first play on the ensuing possession, quarterback Philip Staback committed a miscue deep in his own territory. Standing in the shot gun in his end zone, Staback let the ball slip through his hands on the snap. He was able to pounce on the ball for a safety. That helped Sioux Falls to a 5-0 lead just seconds later.

Just three minutes into the second period, Wieking connected on a 37-yarder to hand the Cougars an 8-0 edge. At that point, Lindenwood was searching for some offense and they got it from a reliable source.

Staback, who has passed for over 3,300 yards this season and 34 touchdowns, hit Matt Bramow for a 19-yard touchdown strike with 7:30 to go in the second. That catch was Bramow's 11th touchdown catch of the year, which tied him for the single-season Lindenwood record. At that point, Lindenwood got to within a 8-7 score.

After holding Sioux Falls to its only three-and-out of the day, the Lindenwood offense heated up with Bramow catching a ball from nine-yards out from Staback. That snare set a school record with 4:14 showing on the clock before the half. At that point, Lindenwood led 14-8.

Sioux Falls threatened with under a minute remaining in the quarter. Facing a fourth-down-and-one and the Lindenwood six-yard line, Sioux Falls quarterback Lorenzo Brown was stuffed by Lindenwood's Logen Wright. That stop preserved a 14-8 halftime Lindenwood lead.

Sioux Falls trailed at the half for the first time this year.

The deficit for Sioux Falls didn't last long. Sophomore Adam Lopez returned the second-half kickoff 91 yards for a score. That return was his second of the year and the first in Championship action since 2006. Sioux Falls grabbed a 15-14 lead at that point and seemingly took momentum.

In keeping with the theme of the second half, Lindenwood's Denodus O'Bryant found the end zone on a 45-yard run at the 11:39 mark of the third quarter. Staback ran in the two-point conversion to cap a 6 play-63 yard drive and the Lions led 22-15.

The next time Lopez got his hands on the ball for Sioux Falls, he ran it back 61-yards on the kickoff to give the Cougars excellent field position at the Lindenwood 26. Three plays later, running back Ryan Lowmiller put Sioux Falls in a 22-22 deadlock after a 2-yard rushing score at the 9:45 mark of the third.

From there, both teams went to work on defense.

With Sioux Falls threatening, Lindenwood linebacker Dan Carlisle stepped in front of a pass from Brown and picked it off in the end zone. That play negated a 13-play drive for Sioux Falls near the end of the third quarter.

That was Brown's second interception that he threw in the game and first time all year he tossed two picks.

However, the Sioux Falls defense and running game came through when it counted. Overall, Lindenwood gained just 233 yards of offense, well below its season average of 512 yards of offense. On the ground, Sioux Falls finished with 178 yards and Lowmiller had a big chunk of that (115 yards).

The score remained tied until the Outstanding Offensive Player of the Game, Wieking, nailed a 42-yarder with 9:50 left in the game. That game-winner was Wieking's third field goal of the day and, for him, was hard to describe emotionally.

"Just being here with these guys and knowing that I can contribute for these 20 seniors means a lot to me," said Wieking. "It's an emotion that is hard to explain (on kicking the game-winner) and I am proud to be around a great bunch of guys."

Sioux Falls finished with 376 yards of offense and controlled the clock for nearly 41 minutes. However, the two costly turnovers by Brown inside the red zone were costly.

Staback went 16-of-26 for 144 yards and two touchdowns for the Lions. O'Bryant rushed for 60 yards on just six attempts but the yardage gave him enough to finish his season with exactly 1,000 rushing yards.

For Sioux Falls, Brown passed for 198 yards going 15-for-24 with no touchdowns and two interceptions. On top of Lowmiller's rushing, Brown had 41 net yards on 19 carries.

Defensively, Dominic Studzinski had a team-high of seven tackles (five solo) to go along with 2.0 sacks. For his efforts, Studzinski was named the Outstanding Defensive Player of the Game.

Lindenwood was led on the defensive side by Brandon Gould and Parks Peterson, who each tallied eight tackles apiece.

Game Notes and Trends

- Sioux Falls kicker Braden Wieking hit three field goals today, which continues his hot streak of making at least two fields in each of his last three games.
- His three field goals was one shy of the Championship record.
- The two 40-plus yard field goals by Wieking is the first for a kicker to hit one field goal past 40 yards in Championship play since records are available since 1997.
- By passing for two touchdowns, Lindenwood's Philip Staback now has tossed at least a pair of TDs this year 12 times, including his last six games.
- With a safety and a kickoff return for a touchdown today, Sioux Falls now has posted 96 points this year on defense and special teams. That point total is more than four NAIA teams have scored on offense this year.
- The 22 points allowed by Sioux Falls is the most since giving up 31 against Morningside (Iowa) on Nov. 15, 2008.
- The 91-yard kickoff return by Sioux Falls Adam Lopez in the third quarter was a first in the championship since Cougar Trey Erickson went 89 yards for a score during the 2006 title game.
- In the first quarter, the team safety recorded by Sioux Falls was the first such occurrence since 1998.
- The two teams scored a combined 22 points in the span of five-plus minutes to open the second half. They had scored 22 points total in the first 30 minutes of the game.
- The three-point margin of victory was the smallest since a 15-13 Carroll (Mont.) win over St. Francis (Ind.) in the 2004 championship.
- According to Tex Noel research, Sioux Falls finishes with the third-highest total ever among any level of college football scoring 775 points. Lindenwood tallied 744 total points, which ranks eighth on this list.
- The No. 1 versus No. 3 match-up was the first time that the top-two ranked teams did not meet in the National Championship since 2004.
- The battle between No. 1 and No. 3 marked the seventh time in NAIA history that this occurred. The last time was No. 1 East Central (Okla.) falling to No. 3 Central Arkansas in 1984. As the third ranked team, Central Arkansas is the only team on record that defeated the top-ranked team. No. 1 teams improve to 6-1 overall in Championship play when facing a No. 3-ranked team.
- With both teams sporting an undefeated record heading the game, both participants have now had an unblemished record heading into the last five National Championships.
- Sioux Falls breaks a streak of No. 1 teams falling to "underdogs" in recent memory. Before today, the last three years have seen the No. 1 team fall to the second-ranked program.
- With Sioux Falls winning the Championship today, it has either been Sioux Falls or Carroll (Mont.) taking the title since 2002. Georgetown (Ky.), who has three national trophies, won it all in 2001.
- Sioux Falls wins its fourth national title overall. The title ties them for fifth on the NAIA all-time list with Findlay (Ohio) for most championships won.

ROME, Ga. – The University of Sioux Falls (S.D.) held Carroll (Mont.) College to 194 yards of total offense in earning a 23-7 win in the 2008 Russell Athletic-NAIA Football National Championship today (Dec. 20) from Barron Stadium. The title is USF's third overall and second in the last three years. Sioux Falls (14-0), which set a school season record with 83 points allowed, avenges a 17-9 loss in the 2007 National Championship to Carroll.

The Championship Offensive Most Valuable Player, USF junior quarterback Lorenzo Brown, finished with 129 rushing yards on 19 carries (6.8 ypc) and 69 passing yards for one touchdown.

"It definitely feels good to win a national title," said Brown, who becomes the third Cougar to be named Offensive MVP and first since quarterback Chad Cavender won it during the 2006 Championship title run. "This takes a huge burden off of my shoulders."

The 53rd event, hosted by Shorter College and Rome, Floyd County, came down to turnovers and field possession. Played in a steady rain for much of the game, the field was slick and muddy from the start. However, Brown mentions that the field conditions did not necessarily affect his play.

"The field held up pretty nice," said Brown, "I was making my cuts and not really thinking about it."

There was not much offense in the first quarter until the USF defense handed its offense great field position. Ranked No. 1 in the country in all major statistical categories, the USF defensive unit proved why in its first defensive stand. Carroll began its offense at the 17-yard line, but lost 10 yards on three plays and was forced to punt on a three-and-out. That gave USF great field possession after the punt.

The Cougars started at their own 43-yard line with 9:19 on the clock. Ten plays later, senior Matt Lindgren capped the drive with a 24-yard field goal. He handed the Cougars a 3-0 lead at the 3:16 mark of the first quarter. Brown rushed for 31 yards on four attempts during that drive.

The Carroll offense did not do much better on its second possession. Two rushes and one incomplete pass yielded minus-seven yards and USF was again in great position to force the pressure. Despite not gaining a first down on their ensuing possession, the Cougars of USF were holding an advantage in field position. On Carroll's third possession, the Saints went without a first down and had to punt for the third straight time.

On the ensuing punt attempt, junior Kyle Cummings reached punter Zach Thiry and blocked the kick. The ball was then scooped up by sophomore Joe Moen at the 10-yard line. Moen returned it 10 yards and with 13:13 to go in the second quarter, the Cougars had the momentum and led 10-0.

Carroll appeared to hit an offensive stride on its next possession, going 42 yards, but the drive was thwarted on a lost fumble by freshman quarterback Matt Ritter. USF looked to go up 13-0 just before halftime but a 27-yard field goal attempt by Lindgren missed.

A Carroll offense, coming into the game with an average of 220.3 yards on the ground, tallied just 36 yards on 21 rushes in the first half.

Midway through the third, the Carroll offense put together an impressive 14-play drive but stalled at the USF 12-yard line. Down 10-0, the Saints needed to put at least some points on the board. But, a 19-yard field goal attempt by Thiry missed and the energy was deflated from the Carroll sidelines.

Sioux Falls seemingly put the game out of reach, thanks once again to the dynamic offensive skill of Brown. He used his running ability to break down the Carroll defense all day but he proved that he could pass the ball effectively. With 7:04 left in the game, he found a streaking Jon Ryan on the left sideline for a 54-yard touchdown pass.

Carroll avoided the shut-out less than a minute later when Ritter connected with wide receiver Travis Browne for a 39-yard touchdown. After a Connor Janhunen PAT kick, Carroll trailed 17-7.

The defense, which carried the team all season, put a trademark on the USF win. Forcing their fourth turnover of the day, the Cougars added a defensive touchdown late. Carroll's Ritter was pressured in the pocket and fumbled the ball away, which was jumped on by junior Drew DeGroot. He rambled 30 yards into the endzone and the Cougars secured their third National Championship.

"This (moment) feels a lot better than when we lost last year," said USF head coach Kalen DeBoer at his post-game press conference speech. "I feel really good with our effort and we continued to work. People didn't see anything flashy today. We just let our guys play football because we have some very talented players."

On the defensive side of the ball, Cummings was named the Championship Defensive Most Valuable Player. The junior linebacker had five total tackles (2 solo), 2.0 tackles-for-loss, 1.0 sack and the blocked punt that sprung life into Sioux Falls in the second quarter.

For Carroll, Ritter went 12-for-22 passing on the day for 132 yards. He threw two interceptions along with one touchdown. Sophomore John Camino rushed for a team-high 48 yards on 13 carries. Rawlings-NAIA Player of the Year, linebacker Owen Koeppen, led the Saints with nine total tackles including six solo stops.

The defensive numbers for Sioux Falls were again staggering. The Cougars compiled four sacks, forced two fumbles, picked off two passes and held Carroll to 1.6 yards per carry (62 total rushing yards.). No opposing rusher reached 50 yards against the USF defense in any game this season.

Carroll ends its season with a 13-1 record and had its 28-game winning streak snapped.

NAIA Championship Notes & Trends

- There were four fumbles in the first quarter (three by Sioux Falls); none of them were lost. Both teams recorded fumbles in their opening possessions of the game.
- There were only four first downs in the first quarter – all by Sioux Falls.
- Carroll recorded its initial first-down on its third possession of the game – their 13th play of the game at the 11:31 mark of the second quarter.
- The first penalty of the game was 7:09 in the first quarter – offsides on the Saints.

- The blocked punt against Carroll's Zach Thiry was the first of his career.
- Carroll trailed 10-0 in the second quarter – marking the largest deficit this year. Rocky Mountain was the only opponent (Sept. 13) to lead by as much as seven points this season – Carroll won 47-14 in that game.
- The last time Carroll was shut out in the first half was on Sept. 22, 2007 against MSU-Northern – a game Carroll won 10-3.
- This year's Championship Offensive MVP, junior quarterback Lorenzo Brown from Sioux Falls, was playing in his first Championship game, while Championship Defensive MVP, junior linebacker Kyle Cummings, also from Sioux Falls, was playing in his second Championship game.
- Last year's Championship Offensive MVP, Gabe Le, was held to 15 rushing yards.
- Carroll running back John Camino rushed for 48 yards. That total marked the most all season for a Sioux Falls opposing running back.
- Sioux Falls has now won 11 of its last 12 playoff games overall.
- Sioux Falls fourth-year head coach Kalen DeBoer now has been a part of all three National Championships. He was a wide receiver on the 1996 Championship team and his 2006 program won the title in his second season of coaching.
- Ranked No. 9 in the country in rushing offense (220.3) coming into the game, Carroll was held to 62 overall (1.6 ypc).
- The Sioux Falls defense ends the season giving up just 10 touchdowns in 14 games (8 passing, 2 rushing). Just three opponents have reached 10 or more points.
- Since 2000, there have been five games pitting No. 1 against No. 2 (including 2008). The second-ranked team has won four out of those five times (including the last three seasons).
- Since the Rawlings-NAIA Player of the Year award was handed out beginning in 1997, the player who won the award was on a team that is 5-4 in the National Championship – Carroll's Owen Koeppen is the 2008 Player of the Year. With Carroll losing this year, the Player of the Year has now been on the losing team in each of the last three Championship games.
- In Championship action, Carroll drops to 5-1 while Sioux Falls improves to 3-2.
- Sioux Falls finished with seven shut-outs this year – one shy of tying the national record set in 1989 by St. Mary of the Plains (Kan.).
- The Carroll offense was held to just 47 total yards on 26 plays (1.8 avg.) in the first half.
- Carroll had its 28-game winning streak snapped and fell for the first time in National Championship play (5-1 overall).
- With three titles, Sioux Falls is one of 11 NAIA programs all-time to earn at least three National Championship titles.
