Today, the NAIA supports smaller colleges and universities, emphasizing character-driven athletics and student-athlete development.

Team Check In

Team check-in will be **Tuesday, December 2** at the Tyson Events Center in the lobby by the ticket office. Check in will be open from **8:30am until 10:15am**, prior to the Teaming up for Character Event. Teams must complete official check-in, at which time official rosters will be verified and signed, team packets distributed, and credentials issued. The Head Coach is responsible for checking in their team (please consider bringing an assistant as there are multiple items handed out at check-in).

Practices

Practice sessions (other than those related to the Semifinals and Finals) will be 70-minute sessions with a five-minute break to clear the court. To schedule your practice times for the week, please call Mike Skaggs at 712-253-6749, **NO EARLIER than Sunday, November 23 at 6:00pm CST**. Practices will be held at both the Tyson Events Center along with other facilities in the local area.

You may request a time of your choosing as well as how many practices (Monday and/or Tuesday). Practice schedules will be configured by the host, and a full practice schedule

(for all teams) will be sent out once completed. Practice times are only reserved for those teams who request it and will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Every effort will be made to accommodate all teams to their preferred time. Each team will be given **ONE** practice time on one of two courts in the Tyson Events Center, which could be Monday OR Tuesday. Towels and showers will not be provided for practice sessions.

Additional practice times may be arranged Wednesday – Friday, contact Mike Skaggs at 712-253-6749. Practices times for teams advancing to the Semifinals and Finals are already pre-assigned and will be shared with those competing teams. Lastly, practice times for Saturday are not available at the Tyson Events Center and facilities will not be coordinated through the Host Committee.

Pre-game Timeline

Once the court becomes available, teams may take their side of the court at any time, however balls may not be utilized until 60 minutes prior to the official start of the match. At no time may teams (or members of a team) utilize their opponent's side of the court.

All teams are invited (and required) to attend the First Serve Celebration on Tuesday, December 2, from 6:00pm-7:30pm (doors open at 5:45pm), held at the Tyson Event Center and sponsored by the GPAC Conference. Teams should enter the facility through official Team Entrance.

The NAIA Women's Volleyball First Serve event at the Tyson Events Center is the official start of the 2025 NAIA Women's Volleyball National Tournament's final site in Sioux City, Iowa. This opening event gathers all 24 qualifying teams for a time of celebration before the competition begins. Athletes and coaches from across the nation mingle at this special reception, offering excellent photo opportunities as the best in NAIA volleyball gather under one roof.

More than just a social gathering, the First Serve event also serves as a meaningful opportunity to highlight the NAIA's commitment to character-driven athletics. A dedicated portion of the event focuses on the recognition of Champions of Character student-athletes, honoring those who exemplify the core values of respect, responsibility, integrity, servant leadership, and sportsmanship.

The First Serve event includes interviews and fun opportunities to get to know the teams and their journey to Sioux City and the final site. Light snacks and a dirty soda bar will be available to the teams.

The NAIA and the Women's Volleyball Championship, along with Special Olympics Iowa and Dairy Queen, will provide a Specialized Clinic on **Tuesday, December 2, from 9:30am – 11:00am**. All teams are required to send at least six (6) student athletes to volunteer at this event; however, all are welcome.

YOUTH VOLLEYBALL CLINIC

On Sunday, December 7, the GPAC Conference will host a youth clinic for third through sixth grades, comprising of four different sessions. All four teams that qualify for the Semifinals will each have their own time slot and grade to work with approximately 35 participants.

Coaches Meeting

The first coaches meeting/final site qualifier call will be Tuesday, November 18 at 10:00am (CST) [via zoom](#) for all Opening Round Matches. This meeting will cover information needed prior to your trip and will be helpful in planning your team's schedule for the championship. **It is mandatory for all teams to have a coach, and an administrator attend this meeting.**

Monday November 24 at 11:00am (CST) will be the [zoom meeting](#) for all teams advancing to the final site. This meeting is required for all Head Coaches; administrators are welcome to attend but not required.

A required on-site coaches meeting will be held on site Tuesday, December 2 at 10:30am (CST) at the Tyson Events Center (during the Teaming Up for Character Event). **It is**

mandatory for all teams to have a coach attend. The meeting will include information pertaining to the administration of the championship, along with other important information.

Qualification Process

The NAIA National Championship includes a field of 48 teams. Qualification plans are approved by the NAC and can be found in NAIA Connect.

1. Conferences and the CAC automatically qualify one berth per six sponsored teams and two for 10. These automatic berths are awarded based on the approved qualifying tournament plans for each conference and the CAC.
2. At-large berths will be selected by the Women's Volleyball National Selection Committee.
3. The host institution (if one exists) may receive an automatic berth if it does not qualify through the automatic or at-large process. If no host berth is awarded an additional at-large berth will be added.
4. There are no limits on the number of at-large berths a conference or the CAC may receive.
5. Qualifying teams will be seeded by the Women's Volleyball National Selection Committee.

Sport Rules

NAIA Women's Volleyball will follow NCAA Women's Volleyball Playing Rules with approved NAIA modifications. The modifications listed below are the only current modifications to the NCAA Women's Rulebook. Any future modifications to the NCAA Rules must be passed by the NAIA Women's Volleyball Coaches Association (NAIA-VCA) and approved by the NAIA National Administrative Council (NAC).

NCAA Rule 11.3.2 – Substitutions-Limitations

Matches between NAIA Institutions will follow an unlimited substitution rule. Unlimited substitution rule will apply regardless of the use of a Libero.

NCAA Rule 1.3.1 – SERVICE AREA

The NAIA will not require a minimum of 2-meters depth for the service area.

Challenge Review System (CRS)

The challenge review system (CRS) is a process whereby video review is used to confirm, reverse or replay specific decisions made by the officiating team.

Procedures, Rule 18.1.5

1. (.1) A team begins each match with two challenges per match.
2. (1.1) If a fifth set is played, each team is awarded an additional challenge at the start of the set, not to exceed two total challenges.
3. (.2) Only one challenge per team is allowed each time the ball is out of play.
4. (.3) Only the team that lost the rally may challenge. If the call is reversed as a result of that challenge, the team that lost the review would be able to challenge another aspect of the previous play.
5. (.4) Only the head coach may request a challenge. The head coach may request a challenge by holding up the challenge card.
6. (.5) A challenge must be requested immediately after the play in which the challengeable action occurred and before the next service.
 - a. (.5.1) At the end of a set, a challenge must be requested before the first referee gives the end of set signal.
 - b. (.5.2) At the end of the match, a challenge must be requested before the first referee leaves the referee stand.
7. (.8) If the video review results in a reversal of the original outcome, that challenge is retained by the challenging team. If the original outcome stands or is confirmed, the challenging team loses that challenge.

Tournament/Championship Format

The NAIA National Championship will include a field of 48 teams. Forty-eight (48) teams compete in 24 National Championship Opening Round matchups played on campus sites nationwide.

Opening-round winners will take part in a 24-team pool play tournament. Teams will be placed into eight (8) pools with three (3) teams in each pool. The winner of each pool will advance to the Quarterfinals. If there is a three-way tie in pool play, teams will compete in tiebreaker sets (see next section for more details).

Teams have been predetermined based on their pool assignment as to where each pool winner will advance into the Quarterfinals. Pool A will receive the #1 seed, Pool B will receive the #2 seed, and on through Pool H receiving the #8 seed.

Pool Play Tiebreaker Procedures

The following procedure is to be used only to determine place in pool play and cannot eliminate a team from competition:

1. Overall match record.

2. Percentage of sets won of those played among tied teams (total sets won/total sets played).
3. Head-to-head competition if 1 & 2 are tied after sets won.
4. Percentage of points won in matches played among tied teams (total points won/total points played).
5. Head-to-head competition if 1 & 2 are tied after points won.

Three-Way Ties – The tied teams in the pool will each play a single set to 25 points to determine the winner of the pool and advance to bracket play.

1. The team judged to be superior by the procedure listed above will earn the first bye in the pool playoffs.
2. The other two teams shall play one set to 25 points (win by two, no cap) and the winner will play the bye team, one set to 25 points (win by two, no cap).
3. Only one team will advance out of pool play.
4. Protocols for the Tie Break.
 - a. Thirty (30) minute warm-up clock will begin after the completion of the referees/captains meeting.
 - b. The lower seed will call the coin toss.
 - c. The higher seed will decide which bench to start play.
 - d. Teams will switch sides when one team reaches 13 points.
5. Administrative protocols.
 - a. Live stream will be available.
 - b. Endline camera will not be required.
 - c. Stats are not kept.
 - d. CRS will be used, and each team will receive one challenge (used in the same manner as pool play – win challenge = keep challenge; lose challenge = out of challenges).

Film Exchange

Opening Round matches will need to be uploaded and will be available for scouting purposes through Hudl via [Direct Exchange](#).

All matches at the final site will be recorded from an endline view by the Championship Committee and then uploaded to Hudl. If there are any technical difficulties with the endline recording, then the live stream film will be used (sideline view).

All qualifying teams will have a Hudl account created and be added to the NAIA Women's Volleyball Championship Film Exchange on **Monday, November 17**, following the bracket announcement.

- Current Hudl users will login as usual.
- Non-Hudl users will need to sign a free agreement to have a team account created under the head coach's school email address."

Post-Championship

Awards

The NAIA maintains a standardized awards program for its national championships, with awards provided to the official parties of the top four teams. A 14-member All-Tournament Team, **including** the Tournament Most Valuable Player, Setter of the Tournament, Attacker of the Tournament, and Defensive Player of the Tournament, is selected by members of the tournament committee in collaboration with participating national championship coaches. The National Tournament Coach of the Year award is presented during the awards ceremony.

NAIA Travel Policy

There are two categories for transportation reimbursement:

1. Trips less than 750 miles:
 - Air travel will not be eligible for reimbursement without prior written approval from the NAIA.
 - Expenses for one standard 55 passenger bus, or up to two 15-passenger vans. Institutions are responsible for arranging all ground transportation needs.
 - Teams traveling close to 750 miles may submit a written request to the NAIA for approval to use air travel. Written request must be accompanied by –
 - The estimated cost of ground transportation,
 - A quote from Shorts Travel for the cost of airline tickets.

- Any airline tickets purchased without written approval from the NAIA Department of Championships will not be eligible for reimbursement.
2. For trips over 750 miles:
- Air transportation will typically be used.
 - Commercial airline flights for up to 30 members of the Official Party.
 - A quote for alternative proposed travel arrangements.

The traveling team's institution is responsible for transportation expenses incurred from campus to the NAIA designated airport for departure and return.

Team Travel Expense Report

Travel and lodging reimbursement to member institutions participating in postseason events is not guaranteed by the NAIA for any event. All transportation and housing expenses incurred to attend an NAIA Final Site shall be the financial responsibility of the institution.

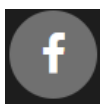

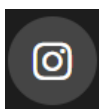

NAIA Sportsmanship and Code of Conduct Policy

Ejections

An ejection or disqualification is an action enforced in conjunction with competition by a match Referee consistent with the playing rules in that sport. Ejections are not subject to appeal. Some sport rules allow protests through an official process outlined in each sport rule book.

NCAA Rule 6.1.2.3 – Disqualification

1. Disqualified team members must leave the playing and spectator area for the duration of the match and may not participate in the subsequent match.
2. For the subsequent match, disqualified players may not participate in timed warmups.
3. Disqualified coaches may not participate after arrival of the referees to administer the match.
4. Sanctions are considered judgment and are not subject to protest or review.

Ejection reports must be completed by the NAIA game umpire ejecting a student-athlete or coach and the Athletic Director of the ejected student-athlete or coach. The form must be submitted to the NAIA within 48 hours after the completion of the contest.

In the NAIA, any ejection in any sport carries a mandatory suspension of at least one game (see NAIA Bylaws Article VI, Section B, Item 7). In addition, the specific sport itself may also carry a suspension, as determined by rules of competition for that sport. If both an NAIA and sport rule suspension apply, the two suspensions run concurrently.

If a suspension is mandated by an NAIA bylaw it may be appealed starting with the Conference/CAC Commissioner. An institution must submit an appeal to their conference within 72 hours of the completion of contest. The conference will submit a recommendation to the NAIA within 72 hours of receiving the appeal from the institution.

The Conduct and Ethics Committee is responsible for all appeals related to suspensions due to ejections of a coach and/or student-athlete.

Once an appeal with appropriate signatures has been submitted to the conference, the student-athlete/coach may continue to participate in the appeal process. If the appeal is not approved, then the student-athlete/coach must sit out of the next scheduled contest(s).

A suspended person cannot be in the competition venue the day of the contest or communicate with any team personnel or gameumpires the day of the contest. The student-athlete/coach will be normally removed from the venue during a suspension. However, the game manager will use their best discretion on what is appropriate to risk management procedures regarding their venue.
