The NAIA was a pioneer in college athletics, being the first to offer championships for African American student-athletes and the first to sponsor a national championship for women's sports in 1980. Today, the NAIA supports smaller colleges and universities, emphasizing character-driven athletics and student-athlete development.

Qualifier Call

A virtual coaches meeting will take place Monday, November 24 at 12 p.m. (CT). This meeting is MANDATORY for all tournament head coaches and will include information related to the administration of the tournament.

Team Check In

Team check-in must be completed 8:00-9:00 a.m. on Sunday, November 30 at the Holiday Inn Resort Pensacola. Teams must complete tournament check-in at which time official rosters will be verified, team packets distributed, and credentials issued.

Coaches Meeting

An in-person coaches meeting will take place Sunday, November 30 at 9 a.m. at the Holiday Inn Resort Pensacola. This meeting is MANDATORY for all tournament head coaches and will include information related to the administration and operations of the tournament.

Practices

Practices will be booked on a first-come, first-served basis. Time slots of identical length for each team, each day, have been secured at Ashton Brosnahan Athletic Park and can be viewed [here](#). Contact Adam Cooper (850.454.4832, adam@pensacolasports.org) to schedule practice time.

Pre-Game Timeline/Procedures

- Higher seed is HOME team for every game. Home teams wear light uniforms and sit on the right side (facing field) bench, and visitors wear dark uniforms and sit to the left of table.
- Game Times –
 - Monday and Tuesday game times are 10:00 am, 1:00 pm, 4:00 pm & 7:00 pm
 - Thursday game times are 10:00 am, 1:00 pm, 4:00 pm & 7:00 pm
 - Saturday game times are 1:00 pm & 4:00 pm
 - Monday's championship match starts at 2:00 pm.
 - *This schedule will vary somewhat depending upon the previous game(s). There will always be at least thirty (30) minutes between the end of a game and the beginning of the next game.*
- All teams get thirty minutes of warm-up on the game field. Teams playing the first game (10:00 am) of the day on Monday will be allowed on the game field at

9:25 am. Their warm-up time will end at 9:55 am, at which time players will be brought off the field and the clock will be reset at 5 minutes, at 3 minutes on the clock teams will be lead on the field for introductions. At 2 minutes on the clock introductions will commence. For Saturday's first semi-final game, teams will be allowed on the game field at 12:25 pm for thirty minutes of warm-up. For Monday's final, teams will get thirty minutes of warm-up time on the championship field beginning at 1:25 pm.

- For Tournament games following the first game of the day, a five-minute period will be put on the clock as soon as time expires in the preceding game. This will give teams that just played time to vacate the field (and their benches), and officials time to inspect/repair the field, etc. When the initial five minutes expires, the Tournament Committee will check the time schedule and determine how much time to put on the scoreboard. The Committee will factor in the 30-minute warm-up period and the scheduled start time of the next game. **NO GAME WILL START EARLY AND NO TEAMS WILL GET MORE THAN 30 MINUTES OF PRE-GAME WARM-UP ON THE GAME FIELD.** The PA announcer and Tournament Committee will assist coaches in letting them know when their team can take the field for pre-game warm-ups.
- Teams (players/coaches/etc.) will **ONLY** be allowed on the team sidelines (bench area) when their team is playing. If your team is playing in the next game, you cannot move to the sideline/bench area until the previous game ends and the 5:00 is put on the clock and running down. (Warm-up Fields: The International Field will be available prior to your allotted 30 minutes if you so choose)
- Half-time is fifteen (15) minutes in length for the entire tournament.
- National Anthems will be played/sung before the start of the first game of each day. Both semi-final matches will have a pre-game anthem(s), and there will be anthem(s) before Monday's final. The Tournament Committee will inform you of any additional pre-game ceremonies that may take place before the start of your game.
- Rosters forms are to be used for starting line-ups. Completed roster forms must be submitted to a Tournament Committee member **AT LEAST 15 minutes** prior to start time of your game. Please indicate jersey color and help us help PA announcers by providing any name pronunciations for your team when you check-in on Monday.
- Overtime Policy – Two overtime periods will be played to completion during postseason. **Sudden victory (golden goal) during postseason overtime will apply.** If the score is tied at the end of the second 10-minute overtime

period, the tiebreaker procedure of taking kicks from the penalty-kick line or spot shall continue to be used to determine advancement.

Weather Policy

Final Site: All national champions should be determined in competition, with all national championship contests played to conclusion. Playability should be determined by the onsite Tournament Committee in consultation with the national office. Every effort should be made by the Tournament Committee to conclude the National Championship on schedule. If necessary, the following Inclement Weather Policy will be used at the Final Site:

If the weather forecast indicates adverse weather conditions will impact matches during the final site, the NAIA can alter match start times to allow competition to be completed. If a match's start time is altered, both institutions will be notified at least two (2) hours prior to the original start time of the match. No match shall be started prior to 8:00 a.m. local time or after 11:30 p.m. local time. If weather conditions do not allow for Tournament to be completed the same day they started in the Round of 16 (day 1 and day 2), or Quarterfinal Round (day 3) within the time parameters listed above, the tournament schedule will be pushed back and if necessary, the scheduled off day (day 4) will be used as a competition date. If competitions on semifinals (day 5) and/or Championship (day 6) are not able to be played due to inclement weather the national championship schedule will be altered to have the Semifinals played Sunday pending written approval of all four participating schools and the Championship the day after. Should approval not be granted by all participants for Sunday play, the round will be moved to the next playable date.

Student-Athlete Experience Event

The final site will host both a Student-Athlete Experience Event & a Semifinalists Luncheon at the 2025 NAIA Women's Soccer National Championship. All team personnel in the Official Party (32) are **required to attend and wear appropriate resort dress attire**. Please submit any allergy requests within the Final Qualifier Form

Teaming Up for Character

Sport Rules

Rules governing NAIA regular season and postseason play are the [NCAA Soccer Rules](#), unless otherwise noted in the NAIA Women's Soccer Coaches Manual.

Rule Reminders:

Game Roster (3.2.1 & 6.3.4) - To require the official NCAA game roster, with starting players designated, to be given to the opposing coach and referee (in addition to the scorekeeper as currently required) not later than 15 minutes before game time. Note: The copy given to the opposing coach and scorekeeper shall have the total number of cautions and ejections for all players, coaches and other bench personnel listed. The copy given to the referee shall not have card information listed. All copies shall include the name(s) and number(s) of the suspended player(s) and date(s) of the suspension(s).

Stopping the Clock (3.8.8 & 6.3.5.4) - To require the clock to be stopped on substitutions made by the leading team or if the game is tied in the final 15 minutes of regulation play and all of overtime.

Postseason Overtime (7.2.1) - To reinstate sudden-victory (golden goal) during postseason overtime.

Tournament/Championship Format

The NAIA Women's Soccer National Championship is a 40-team single-elimination tournament consisting of 16 First & Second Round sites. 16 First & Second Round host sites will be selected based on seeding and the quality/ability to host. The top 8 seeds will host three teams at their host site, while the lowest-seeded teams in the tournament will have a First Round play-in game at each of the three team sites. The second round will include all the remaining teams competing for a spot in the 16-team final site. The NAIA Women's Soccer Final Site is a 16-team, single-elimination tournament consisting of the 16 First & Second Round winners.

Film Exchange

This year all matches at the final site will be uploaded to Hudl. Hudl will serve as the official film exchange for the 2025 NAIA Women's Soccer Championship. Each coach will

receive a username and password from Hudl to access the online film. The film from each match will be uploaded to Hudl within two (2) hours after each match.

Post-Championship

Awards

Team and individual awards are presented to the official party of the top four teams. The championship team receives the traditional NAIA championship red banner. In addition to the championship awards, fourteen players are selected for the all-tournament team, along with the most valuable player, the outstanding offensive and defensive players of the tournament.

Immediately following the Semi-final matches, the awards ceremony for the two semi-finalist team awards will take place.

Immediately following the Championship game, the awards ceremony for the first and second place team awards, as well as all other awards will take place.

Uniforms

Uniform Policy

Teams must have both light and dark colored uniforms available. The higher seed will be the home team and will wear light colored uniforms, and the lower seed will be the visiting team and will wear dark colored uniforms. Numbers must be easily distinguishable from the predominant background color(s) and pattern. Numbers must be displayed on the front and back of each player's jersey. Socks must match the dominant color of jerseys.

Goalkeepers must wear jerseys and socks that distinguish them from all other field players.

Parking

Lower-seeded teams will have their bus drop off in the parking lot on the south side of the stadium field, whereas higher-seeded teams will have their bus drop off in the parking lot on the east side of the stadium field. See Facility Map for additional details.

There are two categories for transportation reimbursement:

1. Trips less than 750 miles:
 - Air travel will not be eligible for reimbursement without prior written approval from the NAIA.
 - Expenses for one standard 55 passenger bus, or up to two 15-passenger vans. Institutions are responsible for arranging all ground transportation needs.
 - Teams traveling close to 750 miles may submit a written request to the NAIA for approval to use air travel. Written request must be accompanied by –
 - The estimated cost of ground transportation,
 - A quote from Shorts Travel for the cost of airline tickets.
 - Any airline tickets purchased without written approval from the NAIA Department of Championships will not be eligible for reimbursement.
2. For trips over 750 miles:
 - Air transportation will typically be used.
 - Commercial airline flights for up to 30 members of the Official Party.
 - A quote for alternative proposed travel arrangements.

The traveling team's institution is responsible for transportation expenses incurred from campus to the NAIA designated airport for departure and return.

Team Travel Expense Report

Travel and lodging reimbursement to member institutions participating in postseason events is not guaranteed by the NAIA for any event. All transportation and housing expenses incurred to attend an NAIA Final Site shall be the financial responsibility of the institution.

Traveling teams will be responsible for a minimum amount of their transportation and housing expenses prior to being eligible for expense reimbursement. The traveling team will receive and pay the transportation bill (air and/or ground) and housing bills incurred to and from, and while at the Final Site. Exceptions will not be made to these policies unless approved in advance in writing by the NAIA CEO.

Credentials

Team Credentials

Team credentials will be provided to all members of the official party upon team check-in. Upon entering the complex, players and coaches should wear credentials, have them visible, or easily accessible. Only credentialed personnel will be allowed on the playing surface during competition. Players/staff must be able to provide credentials upon request or risk being in violation of the roster limit policy.

Media Credentials

All SIDs/Media personnel will need to apply for a credential for the final site.

Applications will close 72 hours before the event starts. Media Credentials can be picked up at team check-in or by contacting the host media coordinator if arriving outside of the check-in window, only with a phone ID. Media credentials will NOT be included in the team packets at coaches pick up.

Official Roster

Submission Process

The official party for each team participating in postseason play is 26 players allowed in uniform and up to 6 support staff. Each team will receive a maximum number of 32 credentials, 26 student-athlete credentials and 6 official party credentials. Each team is allowed up to two athletic training/medical personnel on the team sideline. Only members of the Official Party will be permitted in the team area, which includes the bench.

Medical Personnel - Each team is allowed up to two athletic training/medical personnel on the team sideline. One of which must be an ATC, MD, or DO. A licensed health care provider's license information/number must be submitted in the application in order to receive any medical/athletic training credentials for your team. Applications will close 72 hours before the event starts. Medical personnel credentials can be picked up during team check-in/registration only with a photo ID.

Postseason rosters (and ejection disclosures) will be processed electronically and the administrator completing the roster will sign electronically. Postseason rosters no longer need to be sent to the NAIA National Office.

A copy of this roster must be hand-carried to the Final Site and presented to the NAIA Tournament Committee at check-in. Coaches will be asked to verify their roster for accuracy at check-in.

Once the National Championship begins, no player may play who is not included on the Official Party Roster.

Team Benches

Head coaches are responsible for designating bench personnel. No additional personnel are allowed in the team bench area. Each team's bench area should include the following personnel only:

- Up to 26 players in uniform
- Up to 6 additional personnel (head coach, assistant coaches, managers, etc.)
- Up to 2 certified athletic trainers/medical personnel

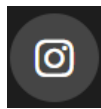

NAIA Sportsmanship and Code of Conduct Policy

Ejections

An ejection is an action enforced in conjunction with competition by a game official consistent with the playing rules in that sport. A player, coach or other bench personnel ejected from the game must leave the venue, be out of sight and sound and is prohibited from any communication or contact, direct or indirect, with the team, coaches and/or bench personnel until the completion of the contest, including all overtime periods. Exception: The AT is permitted to be in the designated spectator area if he/she is ejected. If the ejected individual(s) is a player of record in the game at the time of the ejection, the player, who cannot be replaced, shall leave the game and his team shall play short. Ejections also result in subsequent game(s) suspension as outlined in Rule 12.8.

[Ejection Report Forms](#) must be completed by the ejecting NAIA official and sent to the Athletic Director of the ejected student-athlete or coach. The form must be submitted to the NAIA within 48 hours after the completion of the contest. Protests based on matters of referee judgment or the accuracy of a decision shall not be considered.

Ejections are not subject to appeal. Some sport rules [allow protests through an official process](#) outlined in each sport rule book. **Protests based on matters of referee judgment, or the accuracy of a decision, shall not be considered.**

NAIA Championship Property

All NAIA-branded signs, banners, and displays are the property of the NAIA and must be treated with care and respect. Any student-athlete, coach, or team found damaging, removing, or stealing these materials will be held accountable. The offending institution will be responsible for the full cost of repair or replacement and may be subject to an administrative fine of up to \$500, as well as additional disciplinary action under NAIA Conduct and Ethics policies.
