About the NAIA

In 1952, the organization expanded to include other sports and became the NAIA. The NAIA was a pioneer in college athletics, being the first to offer championships for African-American student-athletes and the first to sponsor a national championship for women's sports in 1980. Today, the NAIA supports smaller colleges and universities, emphasizing character-driven athletics and student-athlete development.

Official Practice Round

The Official Practice Round will take place on Monday, May 11. A shotgun start will be used with the morning wave beginning at 7:30 AM. The afternoon group will tee off at 1:30 PM.

Once qualifiers are determined, information on practice round assignments will be sent to coaches and posted on the Men's Golf Championship Resources Page. Only 5 players can participate in the Official Practice Round. Players are not allowed to use golf carts during the official practice round.

Teams scheduled for the morning wave in Round 1 on Tuesday will play in the morning shotgun start on Monday. Teams scheduled for the afternoon wave for Round 1 on Tuesday will play in the afternoon shotgun start on Monday. Each wave will have 5 hours to complete their practice round. In the event of inclement weather on Monday, a single shotgun start can be used with all 156 players at the same time.

Practice Policy:

Please note that Teams and individual qualifiers will not be allowed to access the championship course from the conference tournament deadline until the beginning of the Official Practice Round. This includes use of the driving range and putting/chipping facilities.

Weather Contingency Plan

Every effort during the NAIA Golf National Championship should be made to determine winners during regularly scheduled competition. A minimum of 18 holes are required to be played to completion. Severe weather conditions shall be monitored by the Certified Athletic Trainer, PGA Professional and NAIA Championship Manager. Playability will be determined by the NAIA Championship Manager in consultation with the Tournament Director, Games Committee, and local PGA Professional.

If necessary, the following Weather Contingency Policy will be used at the NAIA Golf National Championships:

1. If play is suspended, play will only be restarted if it can be reasonably assumed that the round can be completed by all participants that same day.
2. If a suspended round cannot be completed the day it started, players shall resume play on the next available day that conditions permit from the point at which play had been suspended.
3. The NAIA Championship Manager in consultation with the Tournament Director, Games Committee, and local PGA Professional will determine if competitors can play more than 18 holes in one day.
4. If a minimum of 18 holes has been completed, the tournament will not be extended past its scheduled fourth day of competition.
5. Only if 18 holes have not been completed during the scheduled days of the championship competition, the competition may be extended to an additional day.
6. Consideration may be given to eliminating the practice round and beginning official play one day earlier than the scheduled start date based on the weather forecast.

Student-Athlete Experience Event

Visit Quad Cities and TPC Deere Run will host a buffet-style luncheon for student-athletes and coaches of participating teams during the official practice and the first two rounds of the tournament. The meals will be served from 11:00 AM to 2-3:30 PM, Monday, May 11, through Wednesday, May 13. Participating teams and coaches are invited to enjoy a come-and-go meal in the banquet room of the TPC Deere Run clubhouse.

Teaming Up for Character

This initiative allows student-athletes to give back to the local community and showcase the Champions of Character's five core values: integrity, respect, responsibility, sportsmanship, and servant leadership. The Teaming Up for Character event will occur on Monday, May 11, at 4:00 p.m. This collaboration brings together NAIA student-athletes and youth from the local First Tee chapter, fostering meaningful dialogue and connection through the game of golf.

Sport Rules

Official [United States Golf Association \(USGA\) rules](#) govern NAIA postseason play, supplemented by any local rules and the NAIA modifications outlined in the Men's Golf Coaches Manual.

Championship Format

The NAIA Men's Golf National Championship is a four-round, stroke play tournament consisting of a maximum of 156 golfers. Each team competes with five golfers (minimum of four) and the top four scores posted each day are counted toward the team standings.

Playing groups will be made in threesomes throughout the event unless the number of entrants requires differently.

First and second day groupings will be made prior to the arrival of the participants and will be available upon registration. Participants are divided into four tee-off groups. Group one will tee off the number one tee and group two will tee off the number 10 tee the first morning; while group three will tee off the number one tee and group four will tee off the number 10 tee the first afternoon.

On the second day, morning players from day one will start in the afternoon on the opposite tee, and afternoon players from day one will start in the morning on the opposite tee.

Following the second round, the field will be reduced to the top 15 teams (plus ties) and 6 individuals who have not already made the cut with their teams (plus ties).

Pairings and starting tee times shall be established by the Tournament Director in consultation with officers of the NAIA-MGCA. Teams and individuals will be re-grouped for the third and fourth rounds. Individuals on each team are to be re-ordered based on their scores through the second round.

The tee-time format will be consecutive by team beginning with the #5 player on and concluding with the #1 player.

The field will be re-grouped and divided into two groups for the third and fourth rounds. Golfers will be grouped according to the standing of their teams and individual scores. Individuals on each team are to be re-ordered based on their scores through the second round. Individual medalists will be grouped together except when necessary to fill out a threesome.

Tie-Breaking Procedures

The NAIA-MGCA has adopted the following procedures for breaking ties for the pairing of teams (and individuals) between rounds:

1. Team or individual that posts the score(s) first will be seeded higher the next day
2. If the tied teams or individuals posted scores at the same time, then the 5th-man score will break the tie
3. If a tie still exists, then the tournament director breaks the tie(s) with a coin toss

Team Ties - In the case of a tie for the team championship at the conclusion of regulation play, the teams tied for the championship will proceed to a hole designated by the Tournament Committee as the first play-off hole. All five players on each team involved in the play-off will play the hole and count the best four balls. This process will continue until a champion is determined.

For team playoffs involving three or less teams, all teams shall play together (using the 5-4-3-2-1 teeing sequence). For playoffs involving four or more teams; teams will be paired in groups of two and the current tie-breaking guidelines are used to determine teeing/playing order.

Individual Tie - In the case of a tie for the medalist championship at the conclusion of regulation play, the individuals tied for the championship will proceed to a hole designated by the Tournament Committee as the first play-off hole. Play will continue from designated holes until a champion is determined.

In the case of a golfer tied for individual medalist and also competing in a team tie-breaker, that golfer will compete in the team tie-breaker (playoff) until the team championship is decided. Once the team competition is completed, the individual (medalist) playoff will take

place and the golfer in question will compete as an individual. The Tournament Committee will designate different holes for the team and individual playoffs. The Tournament Committee will also draft specific playoff procedures before the tournament begins and include them in the coaches' packets.

Post-Championship

Awards

The NAIA maintains a standardized awards program for its national championship, with awards provided to the official parties of the top four teams. A 15-member All-Tournament Team, including the Tournament Most Valuable Player, is selected. The Tournament Most Valuable Player is included as part of the 15-member All-Tournament Team. Individual awards for the National Tournament Medalist, the Individual Runner-Up, and National Coach of the Year are also presented during the awards ceremony.

Coaches are encouraged to nominate student-athletes each round for the *Character Act Award*, which recognizes individuals who exemplify exceptional character, sportsmanship, integrity, and leadership throughout the championship.

An awards ceremony will take place approximately 20 minutes following the conclusion of the final round. The order of the awards presentation will be as follows:

- All-Tournament Team
- Fourth Place Team
- Third Place Team
- National Runner Up Team
- National Champion Team

Credentials

Team Credentials

Team credentials will be provided to all official party members during team check-in. Once you enter the complex, players and coaches must wear their credentials visibly or keep them easily accessible. Only individuals with the appropriate credentials will be allowed to participate in the golf course competing areas during the competition. Players and staff must be able to present their credentials upon request; failure to do so may violate the roster limit policy.

All SIDs/Media personnel will need to apply for a credential for the final site. Applications will close 72 hours before the event starts. Official Roster

Submission Process

The official party for each team participating in postseason play is 9 players allowed in uniform and up to 2 support staff. Each team will receive a maximum number of 11 credentials, 9 student-athlete credentials and 2 official party credentials. Each team is allowed up to two athletic training/medical personnel to accompany them.

Postseason rosters (and ejection disclosures) will be processed electronically and the administrator completing the roster will sign electronically. Postseason rosters no longer need to be sent to the NAIA National Office.

Official Postseason Roster forms will now be filled out via NAIA Connect (<https://www.naiiaconnect.org/s/login>) and sent to the NAIA National Office. If you do not have a login account, please contact naiiaconnectsupport@naia.org. Once you login, please follow these [instructions](#).

Postseason Rosters (and ejection disclosures) will be processed electronically and the administrator completing the roster will sign electronically. Once the championship begins, no player may compete who is not listed on the postseason roster.

The list of 9 eligible players MUST be submitted by Tuesday, May 12, 2026.

A copy of this roster must be hand-carried to the Final Site and presented to the NAIA Tournament Committee at check-in. Coaches will be asked to verify their roster for accuracy at check-in.

Once the National Championship begins, no player may play who is not included on the Official Party Roster.

National Championship Lineup Form

The National Championship Lineup Form will be filled out in advance and will designate the players in the roster who will begin Round 1. To streamline the check-in process, the lineup form is now to be submitted digitally at the link below. The Championship Manager will print submissions out and the coach will verify their digital submissions at check-in.

Players should be ordered #5-#1 with the #1 ranked player teeing off last on the course.

Substitutions

Prior to any Affiliated Conference/CAC/Unaffiliated Group Tournament or NAIA National Championship round, a team may substitute a player for any member of the team, provided that:

1. The Tournament Committee or Rules Committee is notified of the substitution at least 30 minutes prior to that team member's starting time.
2. The player is an eligible member of the institution's team and is listed on the team's Official Postseason Roster in NAIA Connect.

When a team has substituted a player, the substitution becomes final 30 minutes prior to that team member's starting time and no further changes may be made by the team for that round. However, prior to the 30 minute mark, the team may withdraw the substitution notifying the Tournament or Rules Committee and may substitute for another player as provided above.

The team member that was substituted for may be used as a substitute in a subsequent round if the team wished to substitute another player.

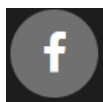

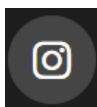

NAIA Sportsmanship and Code of Conduct Policy

Ejections

An ejection is an action enforced in conjunction with competition by a game official consistent with the playing rules in that sport. A suspension is required by NAIA bylaws (Article 6, Section B, Item 7) as an additional consequence related to ejections in conjunction with competition.

Ejection reports must be completed by the NAIA game official ejecting a student-athlete or coach and the athletic director of the ejected student-athlete or coach. The form must be submitted to the NAIA within 48 hours after the completion of the contest.

Ejections are not subject to appeal. Some sport rules allow protests through an official process outlined in each sport rule book. Suspensions may be appealed starting with the Conference/Association of Independent Institutions. An institution must submit an appeal to their conference within 72 hours of the completion of the contest. The conference will submit a recommendation to the national office within 72 hours of receiving the appeal from the

institution. The Conduct and Ethics Committee is responsible for all appeals related to suspensions due to the ejections of a coach and/or student-athlete.

Once an appeal with appropriate signatures has been submitted to the conference, the student-athlete/coach may continue to participate through the appeal process. If the appeal is not approved, then the student-athlete/coach must sit out of the next scheduled contest(s).

A suspended person cannot be in the competitive venue the day of the contest or communicate with any team personnel or game officials the day of the contest. The student-athlete/coach will be normally removed from the venue during a suspension. However, the game manager will use their best discretion on what is appropriate to risk management procedures regarding their venue.
