Practice Round

The Official Practice Round is Monday, May 18. A shotgun start will be used with the morning wave beginning at 7:30 AM. The afternoon group will tee off at 1:30 PM. Once qualifiers are determined, information on practice round assignments will be sent to coaches and posted on the [Women's Golf Championship Resources Page](#). The green fee for the Official Practice Round is included in the entry fee. Each team will receive one cart for coaches. Only 5 players can participate in the Official Practice Round. Players are not allowed to use golf carts during the official practice round.

The Official Practice Round is the first and only opportunity for teams and individual qualifiers to access the course before the championship begins. The championship course is closed for practice from May 6, the conference tournament deadline, through May 17.

Pre-Championship Practice Options

Teams are restricted from practicing at Eagle Crest Golf Club from the conference tournament deadline on May 6 until the start of the Official Practice Round. This includes use of the driving range, putting, and chipping facilities.

Weather Contingency Plan

Every effort during the NAIA Golf National Championship should be made to determine winners during regularly scheduled competition. A minimum of 18 holes are required to be played to completion. Severe weather conditions shall be monitored by the Certified Athletic Trainer, PGA Professional and NAIA Championship Manager. Playability will be determined by the NAIA Championship Manager in consultation with the Tournament Director, Games Committee, and local PGA Professional.

If necessary, the following Weather Contingency Policy will be used at the NAIA Golf National Championships:

1. If play is suspended, play will only be restarted if it can be reasonably assumed that the round can be completed by all participants that same day.

2. If a suspended round cannot be completed the day it started, players shall resume play on the next available day that conditions permit from the point at which play had been suspended.
3. The NAIA Championship Manager in consultation with the Tournament Director, Games Committee, and local PGA Professional will determine if competitors can play more than 18 holes in one day.
4. If a minimum of 18 holes has been completed, the tournament will not be extended past its scheduled fourth day of competition.
5. Only if 18 holes have not been completed during the scheduled days of the championship competition, the competition may be extended to an additional day.
6. Consideration may be given to eliminating practice rounds and beginning official play one day earlier than the scheduled start date based on the weather forecast.

Student-Athlete Experience Event

Destination Ann Arbor will host a welcome luncheon for student-athletes and coaches during the official practice round. Food will be served between 11:00am and 2:00pm on Monday, May 18.

The NAIA and Special Olympics of Michigan will partner to host a Teaming Up for Character golf clinic on Sunday, May 17 from 3:00pm – 4:30pm ET on the practice facilities at Eagle Crest Golf Club.

Sport Rules

Official [United States Golf Association \(USGA\) rules](#) govern NAIA postseason play, supplemented by any local rules and the NAIA modifications outlined in the Women's Golf Coaches Manual.

Substitution Policy:

Teams can substitute up to two players 30 minutes prior to the start of each player's scheduled tee times. Teams must alert the Championship Sport Manager or a member of the Tournament Committee before the designated 30-minute cutoff time of the substitution. Players can be substituted multiple times throughout the course of the championship. Players competing as individuals cannot be substituted for.

Championship Format

The 2026 NAIA Women's Golf National Championship will be a 72-hole tournament. The full championship field size is a maximum of 156 golfers. Each team competes with five golfers (minimum of 4) and the top four scores posted each day count towards team standings.

Playing groups will be made in threesomes throughout the event unless the number of entrants requires different.

First and second day groupings will be made prior to the arrival of participants and made available at registration. Participants are divided into four groups. Group one will tee off on Hole #1 and group two will tee off on Hole #10 the first morning, while group three will tee off Hole #1 and group four will tee off Hole #10 in the afternoon.

On day two, morning players from day one will start in the afternoon on the opposite tee, and afternoon players from day one will start in the morning on the opposite tee.

The tee-time format will be consecutive by team beginning with #5 player and concluding with the #1 player.

The field will be re-grouped and divided into four groups for the 3rd round. Golfers will be grouped according to the standing of their teams and individual scores. Individuals on each team are to be re-ordered based on their scores through the second round. Individual medalists will be grouped together except when necessary to fill out a threesome.

Following the second round, the field will be reduced to the top 15 teams (plus ties) and 6 individuals who have not already made the cut with their teams (plus ties). Teams and individuals will be re-grouped for the final round. Individuals on each team are to be re-ordered based on their scores through the third round.

Tie-Breaking Procedures

The NAIA-WGCA has adopted the following procedures for breaking ties for the pairing of teams (and individuals) between rounds:

1. Team or individual that posts the score(s) first will be seeded higher the next day;
2. If the tied teams or individuals posted scores at the same time, then the 5th-man score will break the tie;
3. If a tie still exists, then the tournament director breaks the tie(s) with a coin toss.

Team Ties - In the case of a tie for the team championship at the conclusion of regulation play, the teams tied for the championship will proceed to a hole designated by the tournament committee as the first play-off hole. All five players on each team involved in the play-off will play the hole and count the best four balls. This process will continue until a champion is determined.

For team playoffs involving three or less teams, all teams shall play together (using the 5-4-3-2-1 teeing sequence). For playoffs involving four or more teams; teams will be paired in groups of two and the current tie-breaking guidelines are used to determine teeing/playing order.

Individual Tie - In the case of a tie for the medalist championship at the conclusion of regulation play, the individuals tied for the championship will proceed to a hole designated by the tournament committee as the first play-off hole. Play will continue from designated holes until a champion is determined.

In the case of a golfer tied for individual medalist and also competing in a team tie-breaker, that golfer will compete in the team tie-breaker (playoff) until the team championship is decided. Once the team competition is completed, the individual (medalist) playoff will take place and the golfer in question will compete as an individual. The tournament committee will designate different holes for the team and individual playoffs. The committee will also draft specific playoff procedures before the tournament begins and include them in the coaches' packets.

Post-Championship

Awards

The NAIA maintains a standardized awards program for its national championship, with awards provided to the official parties of the top four teams. A 15-member All-Tournament Team, including the Tournament Most Valuable Player, is selected. The Tournament Most Valuable Player is included as part of the 15-member All-Tournament Team. Individual awards for the National Tournament Medalist, the Individual Runner-Up, and National Coach of the Year are also presented during the awards ceremony.

An awards ceremony will take place approximately 20 minutes following the conclusion of the final round. The order of the awards presentation will be as follows:

- All-Tournament Team
- Fourth Place Team
- Third Place Team
- National Runner Up Team
- National Champion Team

Team Credentials

Team credentials will be provided to all members of the official party upon team check-in. Upon entering the complex, players and coaches should wear credentials, have them visible, or easily accessible. Only credentialed personnel will be allowed on the playing surface during competition. Official Roster

Submission Process

The official party for each team participating in postseason play is 9 players allowed in uniform and up to 2 support staff. Each team will receive a maximum number of 11 credentials, 9 student-athlete credentials and 2 official party credentials. Each team is allowed up to two athletic training/medical personnel to accompany them.

Postseason rosters (and ejection disclosures) will be processed electronically and the administrator completing the roster will sign electronically. Postseason rosters no longer need to be sent to the NAIA National Office.

Official Postseason Roster forms will now be filled out via NAIA Connect (<https://www.naiiaconnect.org/s/login>) and sent to the NAIA National Office. If you do not have a login account, please contact naiiaconnectsupport@naia.org. Once you login, please follow these [instructions](#).

Postseason Rosters (and ejection disclosures) will be processed electronically and the administrator completing the roster will sign electronically. Once the championship begins, no player may compete who is not listed on the postseason roster.

The list of 9 eligible players MUST be submitted by Tuesday, May 12, 2026.

A copy of this roster must be hand-carried to the Final Site and presented to the NAIA Tournament Committee at check-in. Coaches will be asked to verify their roster for accuracy at check-in.

Once the National Championship begins, no player may play who is not included on the Official Party Roster form.

Medical Personnel - Each team is allowed up to two athletic training/medical personnel on the team sideline. One of which must be an ATC, MD, or DO. A licensed health care provider's license information/number must be submitted in the application in order to receive any medical/athletic training credentials for your team. Applications will close 72 hours before the event starts. Medical personnel credentials can be picked up during team check-in/registration only with a photo ID.

National Championship Lineup Form

Substitutions

Prior to any Affiliated Conference/CAC/Unaffiliated Group Tournament or NAIA National Championship round, a team may substitute a player for any member of the team, provided that:

1. The Tournament Committee or Rules Committee is notified of the substitution at least 30 minutes prior to that team member's starting time.
2. The player is an eligible member of the institution's team and is listed on the team's Official Postseason Roster in NAIA Connect.

When a team has substituted a player, the substitution becomes final 30 minutes prior to that team member's starting time and no further changes may be made by the team for that round. However, prior to the 30 minute mark, the team may withdraw the substitution notifying the Tournament or Rules Committee and may substitute for another player as provided above.

The team member that was substituted for may be used as a substitute in a subsequent round if the team wished to substitute another player.

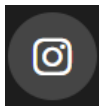
