



NAC Executive Committee Summary

November 2025

Below is a summary of actions taken by the NAC Executive Committee during its November 2025 meeting.

Women's Flag Football Rule Changes

The Executive Committee approved the following rules changes for [NAIA women's flag football](#) for the upcoming season:

Rule	Change
1.4.10	Removed tinting requirement pertaining to eyewear
2.1.4.a-b 2.25.2 3.3.2.f 3.4.4.d 4.1.5 8.5.2	Play clock changed to a single 30 second game clock throughout the game
3.6.1.f	Establishment of a two-minute timeout
9.2.1	Add additional unsportsmanlike conduct actions
9.4	Added rule for illegal use of hands, arms, or illegal contact by the defense

New NAC Member Committee Placements and Reassignments

The Executive Committee determined committee placements for new council members.

- Corey Anderson, Athletics Director at Bushnell University, has been placed on the Polls, Awards, and Statistics Committee.
- Additionally, Rob Miller, Athletics Director at the University of Saint Mary, has been reassigned to the Polls, Awards, and Statistics Committee to help balance membership across NAC subcommittees.

June 2026 NAC Meeting

The Executive Committee reviewed council member feedback regarding the potential to hold the June NAC meeting in person at NACDA. After discussion, the committee reaffirmed the established practice of meeting in person at NACDA every three years and determined not to transition to an annual in-person format.

The committee recognized the advantages of meeting face-to-face but also acknowledged the logistical and financial challenges of doing so each year. It was noted that the Council continues to operate effectively in a virtual setting. Accordingly, the NAC will meet June 16–17 via Zoom to conclude its 2025–26 meeting calendar.
