Educational Timeline

- School year: September-June; Graduation occurs in June
- Primary school is eight years followed by four years of secondary school

Group A: Documents That Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Students presenting documents other than those listed below will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis

- Document must include or accompany report of all final grades	

<i>Diploma o Stečenom Srednjem Obrazovanju u Trajanju od Četiri Godine</i>	Certificate of Completion of High School Program
- Document must include or accompany report of all final grades	

<i>Svedočanstvo o Završenoj Srednjem Vaspitanju</i>	Certificate of Completion of Secondary Education
- Document must include or accompany report of all final grades	

<i>Diploma o Položenom Maturskom Ispitu</i>	Diploma of Completion of the Matriculation Exam
- Document must include or accompany report of all final grades	

<i>Diploma o Položenom Završnom Ispitu</i>	Diploma of Completion of the Final Exam
- Document must include or accompany report of all final grades	

<i>Diploma o Završenoj Srednjoj Školi</i>	Diploma of Acquired Secondary Education
- Document must include or accompany report of all final grades	

Group B: Documents That Do Not Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Comparable to less than completion of US high school

<i>Diploma o Stečenom Srednjem Obrazovanju i Vaspitanju</i> (from a three-year vocational secondary school program)	Diploma of Acquired Secondary Education and Training
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<i>Diploma o Treći Stepenu</i>	Diploma of Third Degree
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GPA Calculation

Calculate the GPA from the average found on the final exam overall result (listed on the "Group A" document), or calculate the cumulative high school GPA by taking the average of the overall results provided on each yearly grade report (*Svedočanstvo*), weighting each value equally, converting to US equivalents and then to quality points.

Grading Scale (may not be all inclusive):

Class Ranking

Class rank is evaluated based on a letter written and submitted by the headmaster or principal of the institution from which the student graduated. The letter must confirm both the student's final position in the student's secondary school class and the total number of students in the graduating class (e.g. the student is 41st in a total graduating class of 112 students). However, students completing tracked or separate degree programs (e.g. *Diploma o Završenoj Srednjoj Školi*) must be ranked against all other students in a given class who completed the same degree program.

Post-Secondary Education

Students will be charged terms of attendance and considered transfer students if they have enrolled as a regular student and attended one or more courses at any of the types of institutions listed below (may not be all inclusive) or any other institution that requires proof of high school graduation as a pre-requisite for admission (subject to review on a case-by-case basis).
