Educational Timeline

- School year: September to June; Graduation occurs in May
- Primary school is eight years followed by two years of lower secondary school followed by two years of upper secondary school

Group A: Documents That Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Students presenting documents other than those listed below will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis

GPA Calculation

Calculate the cumulative high school GPA by converting line-by-line all final or matriculation examination grades on the "Group A" document list above. Each grade is weighted equally. Convert to US equivalents and then to quality points. Divide quality points by the total number of examination results and annual report grades included.

Class Ranking

Class rank is evaluated based on a letter written and submitted by the headmaster or principal of the institution from which the student graduated. The letter must confirm both the student's final position in the student's secondary school class and the total number of students in the graduating class (e.g. the student is 41st in a total graduating class of 112 students).

Post-Secondary Education

Students will be charged terms of attendance and considered transfer students if they have enrolled as a regular student and attended one or more courses at any of the types of institutions listed below (may not be all inclusive) or any other institution that requires proof of high school graduation as a pre-requisite for admission (subject to review on a case-by-case basis).
